



Fundraising – Policy

SpringDale Neighbourhood Centre as a not-for-profit incorporated association has a responsibility to its members, to the community and to its funding bodies to manage all finances legally, ethically, responsibly, and to allocate any funds of the Centre in support of the objectives of SpringDale.

One of the most important roles of the SpringDale Neighbourhood Centre Committee of Management is to ensure that there are adequate resources for the organisation to achieve its objectives.

To achieve these outcomes SpringDale by its Constitution has the power to:

- raise money by lawful means, solicit and receive grants, donations, contributions, and fees or other financial aid;
- conduct fund-raising campaigns;
- impose rents and charges for service;
- employ persons whose services may be deemed necessary for purposes connected with the objectives of SpringDale and its Committee of Management.

Grant applications must be in accordance with the Mission, Objectives and Code of Ethics of the Centre, fit within the Strategic Plan and the priorities of the Centre, and have the approval of the SpringDale Committee.

Social Enterprise activities may provide appropriate fund raising opportunities that can help to fund various SpringDale programs and services.
