

Footpaths on the move

THE Bellarine Rural City Council has received a healthy 156 replies to its Clifton Sprtings/Drysdale footpath questionaire, a copy of which was printed in the first two editions of the *Messenger*

The council had identified footpaths as one of its key strategies, with Clifton

Springs the first zone or town where a footpath plan should be set up.

The widely circulated questionaire asked ratepayers where they lived and where they walked to. The results identified preferred walking routes, which in turn gave a priority on the streets to be provided with footpaths.

When the network of preferred footpaths has been completed, the council will

decide on a plan for their on-going construction.

\$12,000 up for grabs!

\$12,000 in the annual Bellarine Peninsula Art Show, to be held at The Springs on Queen's Birthday weekend, June 5-8.

The show has an unusual entry condition - all entries must be predominantly of the Bellarine Peninsula.

This special condition, plus the excellent quality of the works has made it the leading art show in country Victoria, attracting much needed tourists during the winter season.

This year's show, the 10th, has a \$2000 Mayor's Award and acquisitive awards of \$1200 each for the best oil and water colour.

Special plaques to commemorate the 10th anniversary also will be up for grabs

The Arts Show Committee has received 400 entries for this year's event.

Going on past year's figures, up to 2500 people are expected to cast their eyes over the works.

As in past years, the setting at The Springs cannot be bettered, with display screens and their individual lights enhancing the exhibition.

A preview function will be held from 7.30pm on Friday, June 5, from when all the paintings will be up for sale.

Tickets are available from the Bellarine Rural City Council offices in Drysdale and at the door for \$5 each. Buckley's Bistro at The Springs will be open for lunch and afternoon tea throughout the weekend.

sure you have a look at the wonderful paintings we have on our walls. They have been kindly lent to us by local children's author Nan Bodsworth, and are the original illustrations used in her book A Nice Walk In the Jungle.



BELLARINE Rural City Council and Leisure Networks have been actively implementing the Bellarine Recreational Integration Project (BRIP) for six months through newly-employed recreation integration officer Sally Wall.

The project is designed to meet the recreation needs of children aged five-18 with disabilities.

There are now 16 children involved

in some way in BRIP.

Activities they are attending include Cubs, basketball, horse-riding and

gymnastics.
The BRIP encourages children to participate in community activities with their peers as much as possible. To do this, initial support is supplied by the recreation integration officer. Anyone interested in becoming involved in the BRIP can contact Sally at the council offices, telephone 530300.

FOLLOWING the recent release of drainage scheme information brochures, a public display was erected at the council offices and the Drysdale Village supermaket.

The display graphically shows the erosion problems occuring, particularly along the foreshore cliffs as a result of uncontrolled stormwater dis-

charge.

The displays have received a great deal of positive public response.

The final stage of the publicity drive for the drainage schemes is the erection of information signs on the major access points to Clifton Springs - Jetty Road and Beacon

Point Road.

These signs will hopefully be in place by the time you read this edition of the Messenger.

They tell the reader that a major

stormwater improvement programme is to take place in Clifton Springs over the next one to five years, and encourage contact with council officers for more information.

DEAR Editor.

Re: Around Home Handy Hint in March concerning egg boiling: I doubt if putting a pin in the water will prevent the egg cracking.

What should be done is to gently pierce the blunt end with a pin, skewer or ice

pick.

This releases air from the little cushion at that end (the chook drops the egg, blunt end down; the little cushion prevents damage). The egg is then put into boiling water so that you can exactly time it to your preferred degree of gooiness.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Chicken and pineapple casserole:

Place cooked pieces of chicken into casserole dish. Add can of cream of chicken soup, small tin of crushed pineapple and half the juice, a teaspoon of curry, a tablespoon of chutney and any vegetables you like - for example, onions, carrots, peas, beans. Pour over chicken and cook at 350 degrees for an hour.

When using a pudding steamer, a piece of cut lemon in the water used for boiling will prevent discolouration of the pudding basin.

worked over to a 10cm depth, then firmed up before sowing with a good quality lawn starter and fertiliser. Rake the surface to a 2.5cm depth and spread the seed evenly, then rake over again. Keep the lawn moist until well established, then mow in dry conditions with sharp blades.
