Council has big plans

BELLARINE Rural City Council is calling for expressions of interest in 77 hectares of land on the corner of Grubb and Andersons roads, near the Ocean Grove-Drysdale-Clifton Springs roundabout, set aside for a subregional centre.

The council envisages education and community facilities, entertainment, sub-regional government offices, recreation facilities, a civic centre, public transport interchange, and specialised and residential development on the site.

The suggestion is that the large complex be set up in this central location, rather than have smaller less efficient centres in each of the peninsula's nine townships; most of these towns are within 12 minutes' driving of the proposed complex.

COUNCILCORNER

THE Bellarine Peninsula is to have Victoria's first tourism radio service.

The service, sponsored by Bellarine Rural City Council, will continuously broadcast 20 minutes of things for the visitor to see and do, followed by about 10 minutes of council/community news.

The service will operate from the bottom of the dial on FM 87.8

Signs will be erected on the peninsula's main roads and in shopping centres to advise people to tune in to the budding service.

SIXTEEN children are now taking part in the Bellarine Rural Integration Project (BRIP).

The council and Leisure Networks have been actively implementing the project for six months by employing a recreation integration officer, Sally Wall.

BRIP is designed to meet the recreation needs - after community consultation - of children aged five-18 with disabilities

Activities they are taking part in include Cubs, basketball, horseriding and gymnastics.

The BRIP encourages the children to participate in community activities as much as possible with their peers. To do this, Sally provides the initial support.

SCHOOL holiday activities for primary school children (five-12 years) are to be held at the Drysdale Cricket Club.

Activities for the July 6-17 break are craft, sport and excursions.

COUNCIL by-laws officers are making random door-to-door checks for unregistered dogs.

All dogs over six months of age have to be registered by April 10 of each year. Anyone found with an unregistered dog over the age of six months will be given an on-the-spot penalty notice of \$200.

All areas are being covered in the checking drive.

BEWARE when picking up children from school - illegal parking could cost you a \$60 on-the-spot fine.

Many people park as close to school as possible to allow youngsters easy access on cold, wet winter days.

Unfortunately, many park illegally in and around school crossings.

"The regulations are quite clear in regards to drivers' responsibilities," said a council spokesman. "A few selfish people are putting at risk many of the children who use the school crossing each day. They also cause considerable inconvenience to other motorists."


