

Road duplication: speed is a problem

FOUR 75kph speed zones are to be enforced on the Portarlington Road duplication project.

Passing traffic is causing some concern to the contractor, Rodger and Vickers. mittee has been formed.

COUNCIL CORNER

BELLARINE Rural City Council road construction crews have completed the important Bellarine Road Studies roundabout on the intersection of Bellarine Highway and Grubb Road. The roundabout will dramatically improve safety at this 'black spot' intersection.

VicRoads and the SEC will now landscape and install flood-lighting at the site.

The council management and employees involved thank motorists for their co-operation and understanding during the difficult winter construction period.

Council crews have started work on Swan Bay Road, between Bellarine Highway and Grubb Road.

A design to complement the rural aspect and natural flora and fauna in the area has been agreed upon after several on-site meetings and consultation with the Department of Conservation and Environment.

Care has been taken to curve the road around important indigenous species and further landscaping will improve their propogation.

When completed, the tree-lined road will be in keeping with the environmental effort to protect one of the shire's Significant Roadside Areas


