(b) maximise positive, constructive, and cohesive influences on family life of participants.

(c) act as a preventative agent for social unrest resulting from isolation, boredom, low esteem, and therefore (d) maximise positive, constructive, and cohesive influences on the

general community (e) provide "minimum-stress' opportunities for people who have been socially, educationally, or circumstantially disadvantaged to realise

their individual potential. To do this Neighbourhood Houses need their own building. Most neighbourhood House Management.

Ambulance Station Committee Update

The Chairman of the Bellarine Peninsula Ambulance Station Committee Mr. Bernard Paul, reports that he has received a letter from the Minister of Health, the Honourable Ms. Maureen Lyster. The letter confirms 'New works funding with an allocation of \$300,000 in the 1992-93 year and a total cost over two years of \$600,000 for an ambulance station.' The building is expected to be completed in 1993-94.

Garry Spry, on behalf of the Coalition, has confirmed "that the ambulance station will certainly go ahead."

Hawks Crash Land

The Bellarine Football League grand final held Sept. 13th. saw Drysdale lose to Portarington by 31 points.

In a toughly fought game in heavy conditions, the Hawks tried hard to get on top of Port's strong attack and both sides exhibited tenacity and skill.

Unfortunately it was not Drysdale's day as the Demons went on to a convincing and well earned win.

Drysdale is to be commended for having reached the grand final at all four levels. The under 15's, 18's and the reserves all played well, and despite losses on the day, their participation at grand final level is an indication of the strengths and talent in the teams. Congratulations to the Drysdale Football Club players, members and supporters for a great year.

Mrs. Teehan, Shadow Minister for Health, has stated "that it will commence within the first two years of a Coalition Government." Mr. Paul feels that whilst the Coalition promise is very pleasing, he would have been happier if it had matched the detailed commitment given by the Labor Government.

Nevertheless the Committee is appreciative of the results so far and is concerned to see that an intermim arrangement is implemented immediately to avoid any future unnecessary loss of life.

COUNCIL CORNER

Bellarine Rural City Council's two man 'mossie-busting' team has once again swung into action and launched a six month assault on the breeding grounds in an effort to make the warmer weather more comfortable for residents and visitors.

With the help of an eight wheel all-terrain amphibious vehicle, the team is able to access some of the most remote areas of the peninsula and kill the young mosquitoes with a non-toxic larvacide before they can become airborne.

Many mosquitoes also breed in your own backyards and vacant blocks. Do an inspection to rid your neighbourhood of vessels holding stagnant water.

No matter how vigilant the Bellarine Rural City Council is in eradicating the area of mosquitoes, it cannot control mossies that breed in other areas and then fly in to make life unpleasant for us.

The Council's efforts to gain a voice on the Environmental Effects Study Consultative Committee for the proposed relocation of the Coode Island chemical facility has been successful.

The Minister for Planning and Housing has agreed to allow the Council to take a place on the panel, which will enable it to have vital input to the process without the need for grandstanding and commitment

of large amounts of rate payer funds. It is not a case of 'He who speaks loudest', but requires careful consideration and being heard where it matters most.

Bellarine's Spring Garden Festival is to be held between 10 am and 4 pm on Sunday, October 18.

Three beautiful, unique gardens will be open for your enjoyment on the day and will include musical enteratinment by Morongo Girls College.

The admission fee of \$6.00 will enable you to visit all three gardens: 'Kinross' in Tuckfield Street, Ocean Grove, Newington House, in Harding's Road, Wallington and 'Hermsley', in Avila Road, Curlewis.

VicRoads parking control regulations now allow the use of a new system of parking signs aimed at improving visibility and recognition to enable Victoria to come in line with the Australian standards for parking areas.

New signs will be erected in Clifton Springs/Drysdale on an 'as required basis' over the next twelve months.
