



Drysdale Community Health Centre

Many years of hard work, fund raising & planning by the Committee of Management & the Drysdale/Clifton Springs communities at large will soon come to fruition.

The Building Chairman Mr John Brumley said the new Community Health Centre in Palmerston Street, Drysdale is expected to be ready for occupation by mid February. The official opening will be performed by the Minister for Health, Ms Marie Tehan on Monday, 28 March at 3.30 pm.

The total cost of some \$500,000 has been raised locally, and a number of people have worked very hard at such things as manning the gates at the Geelong Show annually for the past 22 years, catering, raffles & Debutante Balls to name but a few. The service clubs of Drysdale, Rotary & Lions, have been unstinting in their support, as have other local community organizations.

The much loved Drysdale Bush Nursing Centre has been a vital part of the town for over 70 years, and in 1988 changed its focus from Bush Nursing to Community Health. In amalgamating with the Centres at Portarlington, Queenscliff, & Ocean Grove in 1992 the Drysdale Community Health Centre became a member of the Bellarine Peninsula Community Health Service.

To-day's economic climate and the rapid progress of better & more accessible health care have added impetus to the need for streamlining of services offered at the local level.


The essential services of Physiotherapy, Podiatry, Maternal & Child Health facilities, Community Health Nursing, both clinical & welfare, as well as Health Education programs will continue. Support of groups such as Alcoholics Anonymous, Overeaters Anonymous, Hospice Volunteers, Adult Day

Activities, Ladies Auxiliary, are also vital aspects of the Centre's services. District Nursing & care of the terminally ill is a constant need, ably met for all who require it.

Expansion of other services through the greater Bellarine Peninsula Community Health Service will be accessed as the need arises, e.g. Speech Therapy, Dietetic Advice & consultations with the Social Worker and the Psychologist.

The work of the Centre is greatly enhanced by the input of several different groups of Volunteers, including Hospice Volunteers, Volunteer Drivers & Volunteers who assist in some areas of clerical work. This valuable assistance is greatly appreciated.

The forward vision of those who have worked so hard to provide the local community with much needed health care ensures smooth progress into the 21st Century.




Neighbourhood Watch for Drysdale / Clifton Springs





Vasko & Tricia Dansic are the new owners of Drysdale Village Nursery, and have been busy making changes since they took over in December.


Customers will notice a much greater variety of plants, particularly flowering plants at present, as well as an expanded range of garden accessories & giftware.



PHOTOGRAPHY

Some people spend a considerable amount of time & money on photography, but wonder why their results fall short of their expectations.

Many of the "Point & Shoot" cameras can give excellent results. However they do have a limited range of subjects.

A brief review of the picture making process may help the would-be photographer select a more appropriate camera.

The film requires a set amount of light to fall upon it to make a picture. This parcel of light must pass through the lens, the aperture & the shutter. It is ideal if the photographer can vary these three items so that a good picture can be made under a wide range of conditions.

The single lens reflex camera fulfils these requirements. It allows the selection of a range of shutter speeds from

ultra-fast (1/1000 of a second for action shots) to being able to be held open while photographing fireworks or city buildings at night.

Aperture, or the space through which the light travels, can be varied from maximum or wide open to little more than a pin hole. This gives the camera the ability to take pictures under very adverse light conditions, for instance, very bright settings, such as the beach or snow. It is also very handy to be able to control the focus. One should be able to decide if the subject only should be in sharp focus, or both the subject and background. Portraits are often enhanced by having the subject's face sharply focussed but all the trees, bushes, etc. behind as a hazy backdrop to the pic-

The single lens reflex camera also has the facility to take interchangeable lenses. This allows the photographer to see

exactly what the camera sees. This can vary from the dramatic wide angle shots, through to the telephoto sports type photograph which requires large magnification for an interesting result.

These cameras, far from being complicated to use, are in fact simplicity themselves. Once the numbers on the lens barrel are understood, the camera becomes an extension of one's hand.

The simple mnemonic F.A.S.T. enables the settings of the camera to be made quickly & confidently:

F. - Focus on your subject

A. - aperture to be set

S. - shutter speed required to be set

T. - think about what you are photographing

Ask yourself - is the subject well framed?

- could you get closer for a more dramatic effect?
- is the background distracting?

By following these few steps & reading the camera information booklet, the newcomer to photography will be ensured of rapidly developing a keen eye for an interesting photograph & will take a renewed interest in the work of others.



The poor old garden doesn't really know what to do at the moment. It's not sure whether it's winter, spring or summer. The rain that has been about has served to provide good conditions for breeding fungi, so Black Spot, Powdery Mildew, Rust, etc. may become prevalent in the garden.

These nasties will try very hard to take the edge off our flowering displays by causing discolouration of the leaves, and even defoliation (some leaves may fall off too!)

There are sprays around to combat these fungi but an overnight cure is definitely not going to happen.

Affected leaves need to be collected and put into the rubbish - not the compost! - and spraying will be required

every couple of weeks or so until the weather warms up.

On a positive note, the oncoming warmer weather should start to see some great displays of Bougainvillaea and Hibiscus.

Both these plants thrive in the heat, producing masses of flowers over a long period.

The best aspect for them in these parts is a north facing wall, preferably protected from the cold southerly winds that we are forced to endure over the cooler months.

Plenty of organic matter in the ground, possibly a touch of Blood'n'Bone or the like, will provide healthy growth & strong colours in the flowers.

Pets on Holiday

Heading off on holiday? Have you thought about what you'll do with your pets? It's important to include your pets in your holiday plans.

1. Taking your pet with you.



If you're visiting friends or family you may be able to take your pet with you: sometimes part of the joy of having a holiday is being able to spend more time with your pet.

There are a number of holiday homes, caravan parks & camping grounds where pets are allowed. We have a directory of these places at our clinic.



If travelling by car, ensure you have regular breaks for your pet to have a drink & go to the toilet. If your pet gets travel sickness consult your vet about travel sickness medication.

If your pet is to travel by train or plane, ask your vet for advice on sedation. As a rule most animals don't need sedation to travel.

2. Boarding your pet.


There are a number of excellent boarding kennels for dogs & cats around Geelong. Book well in advance as they get very busy during the holiday season. It's also a good idea to arrange to have a look at the kennel before you leave your pet there.

Most dogs & cats seem to enjoy their stays at boarding kennels: it's a holiday for them too! It's usually possible to arrange for special requirements such as diet preferences & medications.

Your pet needs to be up to date with vaccinations & worming before staying in a kennel. All reputable boarding kennels will require a current vaccination certificate for your pet, signed by a veterinarian.


home, especially in the case of caged birds, fish, guinea pigs, & rabbits. There are a number of options for ensuring your pet has adequate care while you're away:

Ask a friend or neighbour

to check & feed your pets once or, preferably, twice a day.

Arrange for a friend or family member to house-sit for you. This has the added advantage of better security while you're away, as well as having someone to empty the letterbox & water the lawn.

There is a number of professional house & pet minding services operating in the Geelong area. These people will either visit your house daily or occupy the house &



charge a very reasonable fee to take care of your pets & garden.

Holiday Hints for Pets:

If taking your dog on outings in the car, be sure to provide plenty of drink breaks heat stress can occur easily in the warmer months. Carry a bottle of water with you for the dog in case you can't find a tap.

If walking your dog along the river or beach, be on the lookout for dead fish. If your dog eats one he'll end up with a very sore tummy. Blow fish are poisonous & can kill a dog if ingested.

Also be on the lookout for

discarded fish bait attached to a hook! Dogs will grab the bait & end up with a fish hook caught in the mouth. This usually requires a trip to the vet for removal. If a dog swallows the hook the situation is more serious!

Only take your dog to beaches where dogs are allowed. Be alert to strange dogs. Most dogs will interact happily when they meet outside their home territory, i.e. the beach or park, but unfortunately we see too many injuries from dog fights that occur between unrestrained dogs. Be alert to this.

UV radiation affects the skin of animals, just as it affects humans: it causes sunburn, dermatitis, & eventually skin cancer. Use zinc cream or blockout for babies on any unpigmented skin, such as ears, nose & belly.

If you're on holiday with your pet, make a note of the local vet clinic in case of an emergency.

If you're enjoying a holiday on the Bellarine Peninsula & are in need of a vet, the Bellarine Veterinary Clinic offers a 24-hour service & has branch clinics at Drysdale, Point Lonsdale & Ocean Grove.




WE HAVE A VISITOR!
