



The 14th Annual Bunyip Festival promises to be a great family fun day, so come along, join in the fun, and support the community's primary school children.






The doors of the new SpringDale Community Cottage have been open for four months now, and activities have flourished.



Representatives from the Neighbourhood Watch State Co-ordinator's Office will attend and present an outline on the Neighbourhood Watch Programme.


1st Drysdale Scouts







Autumn, that fantastic time of the year when the mild, calm weather entices us



out into the garden to enjoy the changing of the seasons. Roses should be budding & flowering with great profusion, just keep an eye out for those nasty little sucking insects on the new growth. A burst of soapy water, garlic or pyrethrum will do them in, but a repeat spray may be required in a couple of days to clean out the next crop.

It's also time to start thinking about changing the display of annuals that are starting to look a bit tired & past it. It hasn't been a fantastic year for Petunias this year, with a lot of people reporting long, lanky plants that tend to lie down and look a bit off. Petunias respond quite well to a light prune while growing; now is probably too late but remember for next year.

Primulas, Pansies, Violas, Bedding Begonias, Lobellia, Cinerarias are all ready for planting to provide a good show of colour over the rest of Autumn & into Winter. A little while longer & Polyanthus will be looking for a spot in the garden as well, so keep them in mind. Before planting your next crop of colour, make sure the garden bed has been well dug over, reasonably free from weeds (if ever that can be achieved), and a light feed.

Snails haven't been as much of a problem as they were early in the season, but they are now busily breeding an Autumn crop of their own, so be aware when you plant out your seedlings. This time is a lovely time of the year, with many deciduous trees beginning to change into their magnificent Autumn colours.
