

## GEORGE REMEMBERS 1945



After serving in the Middle East and the Islands, George was stationed at Canungra, instructing the young trainees on jungle warfare and survival skills, before their overseas postings.

There had been rumours circulating at Wasp Creek, a camp not far from Canungra, that atomic bombs had been dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki, having a devastating effect. George's camp was rife with the rumours, but no official report had been released from Headquarters until the 6th of August.

The War was won. The battle was over. At first the men were stunned, then came the relief of knowing the War was finally over and that soon they'd be returning home to their families and loved ones. After the relief and jubilation came overwhelming sadness. Remembering the lives of friends and loved ones lost, those who'd suffered horrific injuries to both body and mind, and the hardships endured in the prison camps. It was a time of mixed emotions, the War had touched the lives of so many.

George remembers having a quiet dinner at Southport that evening. There were no loud celebrations or dancing in the streets. Thoughts and conversations were focused on the war years and the brave men and women who'd courageously fought for freedom.

Orders were given to close up the Canungra camp. Vehicles and stores were sent back to ordinance, tanks were returned to Wallangarra, all medical supplies and equipment had to be destroyed. This operation took three months.

Regimental Sergeant Major George Hayes was the last officer to leave the Canungra camp.



## CHILDREN'S SERVICES

A variety of services and programs exist in our community for families of young children. These include:

## Play Groups - Drysdale/Clifton Springs area.

1. The Clifton Springs Playgroup Inc. operates four days a week, Tuesday to Friday except for public holidays from 9.30 till 11 am at the Springs Community Centre. Children from birth up until they begin kindergarten are welcome to attend. We run activities for the kids to try; for example things like painting and pasting for those busy little fingers, theme days - dress-ups, colour days etc., and creative activities - things to make for themselves and for others.

Playgroup also provides a time for mothers (and fathers and grandparents) to meet other families in similar situations, and discuss the joys and the problems of raising children. Once a term we also arrange a kids' outing (during the day) and a mothers' night out. This term the children are going to the Pizza hut and the Mums are going to The Palms.

We are an incorporated body and have a managing committee that meet five times a year, to which anyone is most welcome. We are also members of the Victorian Playgroups Association who provide us with valuable support and insurance coverage. ## 2. Clifton Springs Baptist Church Playgroup:

There are presently two playgroups meeting each week, with a total enrolment of 38 families. It is an Outreach ministry of the Church. It is a structured playgroup for children in the 0-5 year old age group. Activities are age appropriate and parents are involved in the planning and preparation of activities.

We include Bible stories, songs, and activities in the program. Parents develop friendships with others in the group providing support and encouragement.

The children enjoy learning through play and participating in a variety of experiences. Both groups are at capacity in 1995, and we have a waitinglist. All enquiries to the Church office: 531833

## 3. SpringDale Community Cottage Kinderplay:

"Kinderplay" is an organised playgroup for PRE-kindergarten aged children. In 1995 there have been five groups operating from three different venues. It is a parent-run playgroup with guidelines set by Springdale. The groups are kept small and families are expected to attend regularly. The children are grouped according to the kindergarten the child will attend the following year, thus enabling children to form friendships with children whom they will meet at their pre-school.

Registration day for 1996 will be held in November. If you have an eligible child and would like to participate in Kinderplay you will need to attend the registration Day or call in at SpringDale AFTER that date. Further details about the Registration Day will be made available through the Messenger in October '95. Further enquiries ring: 531960

1995 saw the introduction of a three year old kindergarten. Currently it operates 2 X 2 hr sessions per week. Children must be eligible for enrolment. For further details and enrolments phone: 531550

## CHOOSING A KINDERGARTEN FOR YOUR CHILD

When making the choice of which kinder your child will attend there are many factors to be considered.

Location and transport facilities, length of session, fees, the type of program offered, but most important is the way you feel about the kinder and the staff. If you feel happy with the kinder your child will feel happy too.

At present enrolment forms may be picked up at individual kindergartens, filled out and returned either to the kinder or to the Greater City of Geelong shop front. From there they

are sent into Geelong where the application is put onto the computer files. Central enrolment ensures that your child will be offered a place at a kindergarten in your area as soon as one becomes available.

Children who turn four years of age by 30th April of their pre-school year are eligible for one year of funded pre-school.

If you change your place of residence and alter your enrolment preference, the date of alteration does not affect the date of enrolment. If you decide to defer your child's entry into pre-school until the following year the original application date will apply.

#### READERS AT RISK

At present, a service is being offred in Geelong to assist children in the 3 to 5 year age group who may have brothers, sisters or parents who have experienced reading difficulties. If you have reason to believe that your child could fall into this category please contact your local kindergarten teacher and ask for an 'Expression of Interest' form to indicate your interest in taking part in the study.

## Councillor's Report

## Coryule Ward, Cr. Dennis J. Blake EDUCATION BOOST FOR THE PENINSULA

Educational opportunities for young people on the Bellarine Peninsula. The Peninsula's population is expected to double to 40,000 within the next ten years with a burgeoning number of schoolage children in the Clifton Springs, Drysdale area.

The City of Greater Geelong Council has a strong involvement in the establishment of two new schools.

Commenting on the recent announcement that the council has leased its Drysdale off site to the Christian College, Cr. Dennis Blake said: This is an exciting, positive use for the site which is now surplus to the City's requirement for office space. The City's Drysdale Customer Service Centre which presently operates from the Collins Street building will relocate to a convenient shopfront in Hancock Street within the coming months.

Cr. Blake said that already, close to 150 Christian College students travel from the Peninsula to attend the College's Highton Campus. The new Peninsula Campus, which will cater for primary school children, will open for the 1996 school year.

"Myself and my fellow Peninsula Councillors, Cr. Dorothy McWhinney and Cr Ian Howard strongly supported the proposal for Christian College to lease the former office site. In addition Cr McWhinney and I will represent the Council on the Implementation Committee of the planned Drysdale Campus of the Bellarine Secondary College," Cr Blake said.

The Grubb Road/Andersons Road site where the Secondary College is to be established was

originally purchased by the former Bellarine Council to establish new Council offices and sub regional facilities in this most central peninsula location. It is a very large tract of land. Already the Peninsula Ambulance Station and SES are established on the site.

Cr Blake said: "I have already inspected the pegging of boundaries on the new site. An access road to allow construction to begin will be the first of the site works which will lead to the opening of the Secondary College in 1997. The College will be a wonderful asset for the entire community because it opens up the possibility to plan towards shared school and community facilities such as a Library and Sortsgrounds. I look forward to working with the other members of the Implementation Committee to further these plans."

## Drysdale Children's Services Centre

The Drysdale Children's Services Centre is a community facility which includes pre-school and child care programs and the office of Family Day Care.

The Centre boasts a service of 35 places for children between the ages of four months and six years. It is open five days a week between the hours of 7am and 6pm.

The staff at Drysdale Child Care Centre are a highly motivated team who promote a stimulating environment for the children in their care.

The range of qualifications held by staff are: Association Diploma of Social Science in Child Care; Advanced Certificate in Child Care; TAFE Certificate of Child Care (Assistant).

Through their studies the staff are placed within a diverse range of community roles. These include Maternal and Child Health centres, Special Needs environment, Maternal Hospitals, Family Day Care Services, Kindergarten and not to forget the Child Care Centres. This provides them with a wide variety of knowledge and experiences which helps them promote the safe, flexible and fun environment that children need to grow.

#### SPECIAL COMMENT:

We have been using the Drysdale Child Care Program since it first opened, and both my husband and I are extremely pleased with it. All the staff are warm and friendly people and care for each child and their individual needs to the fullest.

It's a place where I knew my son would be safe and gives him the chance to mix with children his own age.

The programs are planned to develop their skills, mentally and physically.

The Centre provides qualified staff who are there to support and care for our needs whatever they may be. e.g. allergy problems, medical conditions etc.

I had no problems deciding to send my second child there.


### FAMILY DAY CARE.

Family Day Care is a childcare service provided in the caregiver's home. The caregivers are carefully screened by the City of Greater Geelong.

The advantages of F.D.C. are that the children are cared for in a family atmosphere. The groups are small, and the children are involved in everyday activities, both in and outside the home.

They can be transported to the kindergarten of the parent's choice, to after-school sport, and even dropped off at a friend's birthday party. The hours are flexible, and care can be provided on weekends, school holidays and overnight on occasion.

## Maternal and Child Health Service

The MCH Service is now designed around 10 key ages. These ages are aimed at identifying any problems or abnormalities that may occur. Parents will need to make an appointment at either Drysdale or Clifton Springs for these checks.

The first is a home visit followed by assessments at 2wk, 3-4wk, 8wk, 4mth, 8mth, 12mth, 18mth, 2yr and 3 1/2yrs.



Cut the top off the oranges, 1 inch= 2 1/2 4cms. Very carefully scrape the flesh from inside skin, being careful not to puncture skin, then dry skin completely. Try to avoid shrinking skin. Then take seeds of lemons, limes, grapefruit, or Valencia oranges and start them off in seed boxes or small pots. Choose whatever you wish to grow in dwarf seeds, when seedling gets 4 inches= 10cms. Prepare inside of dried orange skin with equal parts of spagnum moss and very fine loam, and set whatever citrus tree you've chosen into orange skin filled with mixture of spagnum moss and very fine loam, water seedling in, and place orange in container that will keep it upright.

Citrus tree will grow to 9 or 10 inches = 22 1/2, 25 cms and bear miniature flowers and fruit. It is a pretty sight, and must be grown outside, protected from severe weather but given plenty of sun. The roots will come out through the orange skin, and must be shaved off with a razor or sharp knife, and that's what keeps the tree mini size. It's a very interesting past-time. I got this information from a Chinese market gardener 71 years ago. I have practised it for many years and given away dozens. Cumquats can also be used for dwarfing.

We are all given many different pieces of advice as soon as we announce that we are expecting our first baby. We end up confused and unsure. The Nursing Mothers Association of Australia is available to give you information about babies' first food. This comes in the form of breastmilk. It is the right composition for your baby. It comes in a sterile container, is always ready and available (don't we wish that when we are hungry our food was there without preparation?). It is environmentally friendly (no disposable containers, no sterilising solution).

We often give up breast feeding as we are unsure what is required. Choosing to get as much information together as we can, helps us to make informed choices about our children and their future.

A breastfed infant gets all the nutrition it needs from breastmilk for at least the first six months of life, not to mention the bonding for mother and child. This does not mean that fathers don't get a chance to help with their children. If there is a tendency to allergies in your family, feeding your baby breastmilk will help lessen the chances of him/her developing allergies. There are many other aspects of parenting that fathers can do - such as changing nappies, cuddling, bath time, cuddling, playing and of course cuddling.

We are a very friendly Nursing Mothers Group in Bellarine and encourage people to come along to meetings prior to having their babies to get support and suggestions for breastfeeding their new-borns. People with children are also encouraged to attend to increase their knowledge of the most difficult career any of us will choose to take on.



## **ROTARY**

Among the many programs that Rotary conducts for young people is one that has been known as the C.R.A. National Science Summer School, which is conducted in Canberra. Rotary Clubs call for applications for the programs each year from year 11 students, and from these a student is selected to be sponsored as was Penny Hundt for the last school. This is Penny's account of her experience at the school during the last Christmas holidays. John Brumley

In January this year I, along with 287 other students about to enter year 12, attended the 1995 CRA National Science Summer School. I had a great time and learnt a lot about Science in the process.

There were two, two week sessions, running from December 31 to January 28. The participants were selected earlier last year by Rotary Clubs throughout Australia and New Zealand, many of the participants having to pass two interview panels. I was sponsored by the Rotary Club of Drysdale and was selected at the district interviews in Ararat in July.

The National Science Summer School was not an ordinary school, there were no formal sessions. Instead, the program gave us the opportunity of seeing what science is like outside of the classroom. Through laboratory visits to many of Canberra's top institutions and talking to scientists I gained a better understanding of what scientists do and how they work. We also had very useful lectures on University entry, scholarships we should apply for, body language and public speaking. To give

us even more interview experience, we also had mock job interviews while we were there. The whole fortnight was a real learning experience. On my first day I met 143 total strangers who I was going to be living with in the University of Canberra's residence. For myself and many others it was the first time we'd been away from home for so long. We also became familiar with speaking to scientists and professors.

One of the main objectives of the CRA National Science Summer School is to assist in selecting a career path. I feel that it has opened my eyes to careers in science I didn't know about and given me a broader range of choices. I made many good friends, partly because we had so much in common. They are people I will keep in touch with and undoubtedly meet again at University.

I would definitely recommend the program to any Year 11 who would like a future in science. From this year it will be known as the CRA National Youth Science Forum, a much more appropriate name. Any Year 11 who would like more information should speak to a member of their local Rotary Club or their science co-ordinator.
