

THE RETURNED AND SERVICES LEAGUE DRYSDALE

Drysdale Sub-Branch of the Returned and Services League was formed in 1952. Prior to that year eligible servicemen and women were members of the Portarlington and District Returned Soldiers, Sailors and Airmen Imperial League of Australia (R.S.S.A.I.L.A).

The Drysdale club rooms were purchased from Mrs.L.Bennett of Drysdale in 1950. The money for the purchase was raised by public subscription and community fund raising efforts. Then, donated to the new sub-branch as a sign of appreciation for the services rendered by the men and women of the armed forces during the dark days of 1939-1945.

The land and building had originally belonged to the Presbyterian Church, given to them as a County Grant by the State Government of the young colony of Victoria in 1854. The Bennett Family purchased them in 1937.

The first trustees for the R.S.S.A.I.L.A. were Robert Campbell, Arthur Williams, William Nicholas, Keith McKiernan, Leigh McGregor, Robert Reynolds and Stanley Hutchinson. Only two of these men are still alive today.

Over the forty-four years the sub-branch has grown to a substantial membership of ninety-six members, thirteen of whom enlisted from the Drysdale area. The club has three life members nominated by the Sub-Branch B. Wilson,

F.Edsall (dec), George Malcom, and one nominated by R.S.L. Heardquarters with a gold badge, Bill Jones. The Women's Auxiliary also has two life members Mrs.Kilby (dec) and Mrs.E.Noy.


The Auxiliary, with a membership of sixty-two, support the Sub-Branch and the League. They also combine with the Women's Council on matters that concern the R.S.L. in general.

In 1994 the R.S.L. as a whole became an incorporated body. This legal formality has caused a number of changes in the matters concerning ownership and control of Sub-Branch property.

This Sub-Branch is at the present time working its way through the Incorporation Act and negotiating with Headquarters. We are endeavouring to find a way of leaving the land and buildings to the community of Drysdale who purchased and donated them, or some organization which will take care of the area as a memorial to the men and women who served in the armed forces and those who paid the supreme sacrifice in the service for their country.

April is ANZAC month. The commemoration Service will be held in the Senior Citizens Hall on Thursday 25th April at 10.30am. A wreath laying ceremony will follow at the Cenotaph

GROWING OLD - BUT GRACEFULLY

Now 73 years after its foundation we could be excused for thinking that the need for the services provided by Legacy would be decreasing. However this is not so and they are expected to continue to increase until reaching a peak in the year 2000.

This means that the same dedication and enthusiasm that has existed for all of the year since Legacy began will have to continue but perhaps with some changes of direction.

Because we are all getting older "aged care" will become an increasing responsibility for organisations such as Legacy. With this is mind a special committee has been formed under the chairmanship of Geelong Legatee Bill North to discuss and advise on future needs and legislation on aged care.

Community Aged Care Packages (C.A.C.P.s) funded by the Federal Government are available and will be used as part of the programme arranged by Legacy for elegible widows.

Other areas of change require constant attention by Legacy in assuring that the widows we care for receive the best of available services. There have been for instance many recent changes to the medical acceptance of illnesses caused by smoking, consumption of alcohol, over exposure to sun and stress to name a few. which means that in some cases where War Widows' pensions have been disallowed, they may now be accepted.

In this regard Legatees are examining their lists of widows to check that any widow who may be eligible for a pension is advised to re-ap-

LIONS - APEX - COMBINED EFFORT


SpringDale Community Cottage has once again been forced to turn to the generous works of the community.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT ON THE BELLARINE PENINSULA -

BUS REVIEW

With a new Secondary College about to commence in the 1997 year in central Bellarine, review of bus routes in the area will be undertaken.

Member for Bellarine Garry Spry, led a deputation to a group of five Cabinet ministers including the Minister for Public Transport the Hon. Alan Brown, in City Hall on Tuesday, February 20. At that meeting which was attended by a spokesperson, Mr. John Murray, Bill McKinley and Paul Kenny, the need for the review was emphatically put and well received.

The Minister responded favourably to the concerns of the deputation and indicated that an internal review would be undertaken dur-

ing the first half of the next financial year by Department of Transport Officers, in conjunction with the advice of Officers from the Department of School Education.

The discussion also ranged over the difficulties of servicing the scattered populations of the Bellarine Peninsula in terms of bus frequency and bus routes. The Minister agreed to include in the review, weekend bus services for Clifton Springs and Leopold.

Member for Bellarine Garry Spry said that he was delighted with the result and indications from members of the deputation were similarly pleased with the way their concerns had been listened to by their Government Ministers. They were particularly pleased with the reaction of the Minister for Public Transport, the Hon. Alan Brown.

NEW SCHOOLS FOR DRYSDALE

Following an extensive shortlisting process, concept plans prepared by award winning Geelong architects, McGlasham and Everist have been selected for the design of the new primary school and associated secondary college in the Drysdale parish. Innovative plans for the \$3m project provide for a first stage of prep to Year 6 primary and years 7-10 secondary facilities.

Development of the schools on 9.7ha of undulating farmland on the Bellarine Peninsula, at the corner of Andersons and Gillies Roads, Drysdale, will provide co-educational facilities for primary and secondary education. The site is adjacent to parkland and a bus interchange with community recreation facilities proposed by the City of Greater Geelong.


Location and design of Stage 1 specialist facilities will take account of future school growth. Utilisation by both primary and secondary schools of the integrated joint facilities will encourage the concept of continuity of schooling. Subsequent stage development of the Catholic secondary campus will ensure that a comprehensive VCE curriculum is offered on the peninsula. Recently, a joint meeting of the Catholic Education Office, Department of Secondary Education and the City of Greater Geelong discussed the possibility of sharing expensive specialist facilities. This will maximise the development opportunities and the potential for community sharing of facilities. Further discussions regarding co-operative arrangements are planned with the Bellarine Secondary College Implementation Committee.

The 1997 school year will commence with a proposed intake of 180 primary (Prep to Year 6) and 90 students in Years 7 and 8. Applications for the primary school Principal closed in February and an announcement of the appointment to this important position is expected in the near future, as will the position of Campus Director for the secondary campus.

COUNCILLOR BLAKE RECONFIRMS COUNCIL'S OPPOSITION TO THE PROPOSED HAZARDOUS CHEMICAL STORAGE FACILITY RELOCATION TO PT LILLIAS.

Thank you the wider community of Geelong and the Bellarine Peninsula who have clearly said they do not want Australia's Largest Chemical Dump in Geelong.

Thank you to all the people that have supported Council's decision to oppose the State Government's move to relocate this Chemical Stor-

age Dump to Geelong.

I believe over two-thirds of the community oppose the move. And when Geelong's identity is at stake here, I am proud of the people of Geelong, for speaking out and voicing their democratic rights.

The City of Greater Geelong Council opposes the selection of Pt Lillias as a site for a Chemical Port, and for the storage of hazardous chemicals.

It does not support the development of downstream industries which are incompatible with the environment.

With the health and well-being of the Geelong Community at stake, it's no wonder we tossed out the previous policy adopted by the Commissioners.

The Commissioners, prior to their decision to support the relocation, did not undertake the necessary strategic studies and public consultation to support their Pt Lillias policy.

Council is 100% committed to enhancing the Coastal Environment and the quality of the Bay. We must all protect its beauty and not allow it to be destroyed.

Issues

- 1. Selection of Pt Lillias Selection of the site was undertaken in an undemocratic way.
- 2. Health and Safety of the Chemical Facility - Safety impacts of storing chemical and armaments is a major concern. How will the health issues be managed andmonitored?
- 3. Impacts on the Natural and Social Environment - A major concern is the impact on the surrounding wet lands for the migratory birds and for the continued operation of Cheetham Salt. Environmental and social values, air quality and local climate will be eroded.
- 4. Transport and Emergency Services All residents of the City of Greater Geelong and visitors should be concerned with the future use of roads and highways in the area. Road accidents, spills and fires will severely diminish the safety of other road users and surounding areas.
- 5. Cultural Heritage The Wathaurong Aboriginal Co-operative will have their Cultural Heritage sites destroyed.
- Consultation The selection of the preferred site did not seek prior views of the Community. The Commissioners had not consulted the people of Geelong and Bellarine Peninsula, yet they gave total support to the relocation of the Hazardous Chemical Storage Facility from Coode Island to Pt Lillias. Prior to their decision they did not undertake the necessary strategic studies within the whole

- 8. Support of Chemical Industry The industry shows all favouritism towards industry economic arguments over the environment, health and well-being of the community at large and the future generations,

- * A Chemical spill will reach Rippleside Park in 3 hours.
- * There will be at least a 100% increase in tankers on the Princes Highway.

IN YOUR GARDEN

Autumn is now well and truly upon us, the nights are a lot cooler and the days are noticeably shorter. There are still plenty of things to do around the garden, one of the more important is to give everything a good feed. With the wide range of plant foods now available on the market it can be quite confusing as to what to use for the task at hand. There are a few quite good pelletised fertilisers around that are based on animal manure, blood and bone, fish meal, etc. These are quite effective, not only supplying nutrients, but as they break down a certain amount of humas is added to the soil as well. They can be applied to all but the most sensitive plants without fear of a terminal illness as a result. Quite heavy dressings can be applied if the situation warrants, but normally the recommended dressing is quite adequate to spur on the plants to dizzy new heights of glorious growth and flower. Ooops got carried away with fragrance that accompanies these things for a couple of days.

There are specific formulation fertilisers which are designed with the requirement of specific groups of plants in mind, e.g. Camellia, Azalea Rhododendron, Citrus and Fruit Tree, Roses, etc. These are chemical based fertilisers which can provide very good results if the directions are followed correctly. If too much of the good thing is applied then it is possible to cause the premature demise of otherwise healthy plants.

The old petunias will be starting to look a bit tatty and it may be time to think about what goes in the garden beds next for Spring, Primula, Polyanthus, Cineraria, Pansy, Viola, Stock, Snapdragon and lots more can be planted now. Be careful not to wait too long before redoing the garden beds, as once we are into Winter not very much will want to grow and your spring show may not be too flash. There is still plenty of time but don't forget to plant your bulbs.
