DRYSDALE'S MIGHTY HAWKS

Drysdale Football Club first played a game of football behind the local hotel (the Bucks Head Hotel) also there was a race course around the ground. This match took place on Saturday, 14th June, 1879 against Chilwell seconds. Drysdale were beaten by 4 goals.

Some of the sides Drysdale played in the early years were: Chilwell, Curlewis, Birregurra, East Geelong, North Geelong, The Artillery, Portarlington, Wanderers.

One game against Artillery on 7th July, 1879 was a draw, one goal a piece. This game was finished on the following Saturday but no result is available.

Drysdale has had different colours of jumpers over the past 127 years - maroon/gold, blue/white, red/white and the current colours of brown/gold.

In 1903 Drysdale were Premiers and won a magnificent marble mantle clock which can now be seen in the Football Club Rooms. The old football ground in the park had a fall of fourteen feet from east to west before the Council levelled it out in the early years after the war.

Drysdale has 4 sides (Under 15, Under 18, Reserves, Seniors) and are affiliated with the Bellarine and District Football League.

Drysdale's current Assistant Coach, David Masek who plays at full forward is the leading goalkicker in the Senior competition and has kicked over 100 goals at this stage of the season whilst some of our Under 18 players David Beim, Mathew Chambers and Aaron Eddy have earned themselves games in the Senior team, so this points well to our future as we have youthful sides playing in both Seniors and Reserves teams.

We will be hosting the Preliminary and Grand Finals once again and we hope that the Hawks will be represented on the big day and maybe a flag could be ours.

Recently a re-union of the 1966, 1976 and 1986 Premiership teams brought together many past players and many friendships were renewed by those who attended and it was pleasing to note the number of players who played in those teams still live in the Geelong area.

Our season culminates in the Senior Presentation Evening which is to be held at the Club on A.F.L. Grand Final Eve.





BELLARINE WINS GOLD

On Thursday 18th July, in front of a crowd of about 1,500 at the Geelong Pura Milk Arena, the Geelong Regional Rock Eisteddfod final was held.

The Rock Eisteddfod Challenge is a performing arts competition between secondary schools held nationally and around the globe. It provides students with an opportunity to produce and stage a piece of live entertainment. The focus of the Rock Eisteddfod challenge is on youth being the best they can be and on "getting high on life" without the use of tobacco, alcohol or other substances. It is an effective vehicle to communicate health and social education messages to teenagers in a supportive and positive environment. Rock Eisteddfod Challenge aims to empower youth with the resources and opportunities to express their creativity through music and dance.

The scene opens up with our lovely deb girls getting ready at 'Trixies Salon' while the boys are greasing up their hair in front of a mirror. Soon the props pull apart



TERM 3 REPORTING TO PARENTS

Clifton Springs Drainage Schemes Abandoned

Summary

A review of special charge schemes proposed for the Clifton Springs area has been undertaken. The review was conducted to re-assess the need for the works, whether design standards are reasonable, the extent of public concerns and options available to the Council if it wishes to reconsider the schemes.

The findings are that:

There are flooding problems to be addressed.

The solutions proposed appear to be out of proportion to the problems to be overcome.

Design standards, in most cases, are higher than what is normal for residential development.

There is a need for greater participation by those who have to pay in the selection of the level of protection from flooding required.

The outfalls at Clifton Springs urgently require attention, particularly one area near the

bowling club.

There are sufficient questions about the extent of the proposed schemes to conclude that both schemes should be withdrawn to enable further consideration of alternatives.

Alternative schemes should not proceed until there has been a review of the user pay policy.

Discussions

The urgent problem to fix is the massive erosion of outfalls, threatening collapse of property at the bowling club. The question is whether or not it is necessary to undertake the whole of the main drainage and street and easement drainage at the same time in order to address the outfall problem. The finding in the review is that it is not.

There are a number of easement drains which could proceed if a majority of the owners had a desire to do so, and there are some examples of flooding and large street flows. Most do not threaten to flood houses.

Whatever happens, the outfalls have to be fixed, particularly the one near the bowling green which is urgent.

As a result of the public consultation process of late 1995, a Clifton Springs Drainage Actions Committee was formed and has carried out a survey of problems and attitudes in the area known as Catchment 45. The Committee reports that 6% (22 in number) of respondents reported problems, but 95% were opposed to the scheme. The way in which the Committee has done its work and communicated its concerns to Council Officers is commended and it is considered that the Committee would be a valuable contact point for futher discussions.

The assessment at present is that as the residents have no real desire for the schemes, and there are questions about the extent and stand-

ard of the work proposed, the schemes as presented should be withdrawn. The public consultation phase should take a different approach, one of working with residents to produce solutions to problems with drainage that the property owners, or at least a majority, are prepared to fund.

Without much doubt, the expense of fixing erosion gullies is a Council responsibilty. The additional cost of the larger pipes in this instance is relatively minor. The estimated cost of replacing the two outfalls at the bowling club and at Edgewater Drive is \$1,320,000. The work can be staged.

Conclusion

There are so many questions about the extent of the work proposed, the standards adopted and the relevance to modern drainage principles that it is concluded that both schemes should not proceed in their current form.

Resolution By Council

That:

- 1. Proposals for a special charge scheme for outfall, trunk and easement drains for catchment 41 and 45, be abandoned.
- 2. Council funding be considered for the replacement of the existing outfalls at Clifton Springs.
- 3. The Clifton Springs Drainage Action Committee be encouraged to work with Council Officers to review drainage problems and possible solutions.

IN YOUR GARDEN

Spring is most definitely in the air, the thought of some warmer weather is a very appealing With the onset of Spring will come a burst of weed growth that you can never believe, even though it happens every year. With a bit of motivation it is possible to make an impact on the beasties before they get too carried away with the change of season. It is a good time to be putting the finishing touches to the vegie garden by adding lots of manure and composty things, these will provide a rich growing medium for seedlings. Don't be in a great screaming hurry to plant everything yet, as there is quite a bit of coolish to cold weather to come. No I'm not being negative, but we still have a bit of frost season to come, and we always seem to have a last burst of Winter to Spring somewhere.

If your Nectarine and Peach trees have been suffering with Leaf Curl then you should be looking to spray them with a Copper based spray. Ideally a mid Winter spray, followed by a repeat as the first Blossoms show will start them off well. Sometimes it may take a year or two to get the trees looking good again but it is worth doing if you want strong healthy trees. Around the old Apple tree one can plant things like Garlic, Chives, Shallots and the like, these tasty smelling little 'what's it's' will help keep Codling Moth away as well as providing a culinary source for cooking. Lemon trees on the other hand really don't like any company at all. They prefer the ground underneath their foliage to be free of growth, a light mulch is usually the best option. weed free area then easily defines where you should throw the Citrus food in September and May.

AFFIDAVITS, STATUTORY DECLARATIONS & PASSPORT APPLICATIONS

These days there are many documents which are required to be witnessed before a qualified person. For instance, statutory declarations, affidavits, passport applications, solicitors certificates.

STATUTORY DECLARATIONS:

There is no longer a prescribed form of Statutory Declaration under the Evidence Act 1958.

A person who makes a Statutory Declaration must sign the document and should repeat the following words: "I solemnly and sincerely declare that this document is signed in my name and handwriting and the contents of this my declaration are true and correct in every particular."

The Bible is never used when making a Statutory Declaration or an Affirmation.

The following is a list of some persons who may witness a Statutory Declaration under the Evidence Act 1958.

Solicitors

Justice of the Peace

A member of either House of Parliament of Victoria

A registered medical practitioner

A dentist

A Veterinary surgeon

A Pharmacist

A Bank Manger

AFFIDAVITS:

An affidavit is a written statement sworn on the Bible or the New Testament pursuant to the Evidence Act 1958. An affidavit is generally used in Court matters where a witness is unable to give evidence personally.

The following is a list of some persons who may be able to take an Affidavit under the Evidence Act 1958:

Any Judge

- A Solicitor holding a current Practising Certificate pursuant to the Legal Profession Practice Act 1958.
- A Master of the Supreme court or of the County Court
- A member of either House of Parliament

Justice of the Peace

 A member of the police force of o above the rank of Sergeant

It is to be noted that each State of Australia has different requirements in relation to Statutory Declarations and Affidavits.

There are special procedural requirements in relation to obtaining and administering Oaths and Statutory Declaration on disabled people, sight impaired persons, illiterate persons and infants.

If a person does not wish to swear on the Bible he or she may make an Affirmation.

AUSTRALIAN PASSPORT APPLICATION:

The Australian Passport Application form requires that a recognised person provide a Proof of Identity Declaration.

The person who provides the Proof of Identity Declaration must:

Not be related by birth or marriage to the applicant

Have known the applicant for at least one year Be an Australian citizen

Be currently employed in one of the following professions

The League and the Sub-Branches are in the forefront of any battles for better conditions for the ex-servicemen and women, but they cannot carry on this vital work without the help of others.


