



# CITY PLANS FOR COMMUNITY WITH SUB REGIONAL CENTRE

The commencement of the school year at the new Bellarine Sub Regional Centre heralded the first stage in the City of Greater Geelong's plan for the project.

The City has committed \$1.5 million towards the development of this centre.

Coryule Ward Councillor, Dennis Blake, said the City had allocated \$100,000 in the 1995/96 year, would spend a further \$1,150,000 in the 1996/97 year and set aside \$250,000 in 1997/98.

"While the City has made no contractual or other commitment to provide any further facilities at this site, it has laid the foundations for a small community to be created there," said Cr Blake.

"In addition to the Council contribution to the development of the two schools and future community, Council has set aside one hectare of land between the two new schools, which will enable the establishment of shared community and sporting facilities in the future."

"This will prevent the duplication of sporting, cultural and arts facilities as the region develops."

"Council has also allocated land for a transport interchange which will service not only the Bellarine Sub Regional Centre, but the whole Bellarine Peninsula."

Cr Blake said the City had also prepared an amendment to the planning scheme for the balance of the site, approximately 50 hectares. "Consistent with the outline development plan which has been exhibited recently, this would allow the rest of the area to be developed for residential and rural residential purposes," said Cr Blake.

"Council has set aside approximately three hectares of land adjacent to the two schools as public open space to be developed as an extension to the Basin nature Reserve, which is proposed to be used for nature studies for the two schools." said Cr Blake.

The City's current work program at the site, involving road construction and the provision of other infrastructure will be substantially completed over the next month.

The City has coordinated the provision of all infrastructure and assisted in facilitating the development of the two schools - the Bellarine Secondary College Main Campus Stage One and the St. Thomas Primary School and Bellarine Campus of the Catholic Regional College.

The City has also met with community representatives to discuss the future possibility of building a swimming pool at the sub regional centre.

## CLIFTON SPRINGS FORESHORE DRAFT MASTER PLAN ON DISPLAY

Members of the public have been invited to comment on the draft Landscape Master Plan for the Clifton Springs Foreshore.

The draft plan covers the area from the boat harbour to Beacon Point Road.

Clifton Springs Foreshore Advisory Committee Chairman, City of Greater Geelong Cr. Dennis Blake, said the draft master plan was developed by the Committee, which comprises members of the Rotary Club of Drysdale and the Clifton Springs/Drysdale community, working with Council officers and consultant landscape architects Chris Dance Land Design.

"The draft master plan capitalises on the great potential of this section of the coast, and the master planning process has moved from the initial site analysis phase, through the identification of opportunities for landscape improvements to the preparation of the draft master plan, which has now been completed," said Cr. Blake.

"We are now inviting members of the community to comment on the draft master plan, as they will provide valuable input into the ongoing improvements to the Clifton Springs foreshore".

The draft master plan drawings will be placed on display for public comment at the City of Greater Geelong's Drysdale Customer Service Centre and Library from March 7 to March 27.

Submission forms will be available at the Customer Service Centre and Library for members of the community to complete and forward to Council by March 27, 1997.

## DRYSDALE CAMPUS OPENS

A new era in the provision of Secondary Education on the Bellarine Peninsula began when the Drysdale Campus of Bellarine Secondary College opened its doors to 400 year 9 and 10 students on January 31st.

The students have settled in very well to the new environment, and the academic program is well underway. The school conducted a successful Swimming Sports day on February 4th with students from all three campuses either competing, watching, or helping out as officials. Many students are now enthusiastically training for the upcoming Summer Sports program.

Minor works still continue at the site, with covered ways, asphalt areas for hardcourt sports and landscaping making this fabulous resource that much more pleasurable. The recent hot, dry weather has taken its toll on the oval, and we are now watering this and the newly grassed areas so that they can be ready for active and passive recreational activity.

Staff and students are working collaboratively to develop lunchtime activities and clubs. It is these early efforts that will give shape to the culture of the campus both now and into the 21st century.

On Tuesday February 25 the school held a Family BBQ night. ## IN YOUR GARDEN

Autumn is here at last, hopefully it will bring with it some very welcome rain. Already the sun is getting lower in the sky and the days are starting to shorten. This time of the year is great for the garden, there is still plenty of warmth for growth but not too much to sizzle the gardener. The garden will respond very well to a general feed with the contents of the old compost heap, animal manures or the like. The major advantage of feeding with these sorts of things is that they add condition to the soil whilst encouraging worms and assorted microbes into the garden beds. These desirable beasties work hard under the ground to spread the food you supply to the root systems of your plants making for a happy and healthy garden. A well composted/ manured garden is much easier to keep moist because of the assorted goodies piled on top of the existing soil, acting as a barrier to evaporation by the sun.

Autumn also brings with it a new batch of seasonal plants to brighten up the garden. Pansies are back in fashion in a big way, with many new releases. They come in whites, pinks, blues, yellows, black, reds, oranges, and a host of color co-ordinated or brightly contrasting mixtures. These plants will last for 6-8 months in the garden with some care, providing lots of flowers the whole time. Another plant that excels at this time of the year is the Japanese Windflower. These tough little plants will bush up to 60-80cm high, then provide a massed display of flowers above that. The display of flowers waves beautifully above the rest of the garden. They come in white, pink, mauve, single or double flowers.

## SUMMER GROOMING TIPS - FOR DOGS

Summer is a great time of the year to spend with your dog. With the extra hours of daylight there is more time for longer walks, and of course on the Peninsula the joy of being able to take your dog for swims at designated beaches. For some owners it can also mean a lot of extra work. It is the time of the year when thorns, burrs and grass seeds can create a big problem to dogs with longer coats or hairy paws. Grass seeds have the ability to work their way into the skin between the paws where they can set up an infection if not removed promptly. The ears can also be a big problem, with grass seeds working their way into the ear, which is very annoying for the dog.

It is important after every walk to thoroughly check between the pads and toes of your dog's feet, and check the ears for any seeds that might be there. This is very important in the spaniel breeds, and the cute fluffy types. This task is much easier if the hair between the toes and pad is clipped.

After having your dog at the beach it is a good idea to rinse the salt water off the dog's coat. If the dog is very dirty, specially large breeds, a hydro bath is an excellent way to remove sand, mud and loose hair. The water massaging around through the dog's coat is

Regular grooming and bathing from early age help produce a good coat and also accustoms the dog to the procedure. Before bathing your dog make sure all tangles and knots are removed first. Once a knot gets wet they turn into matts and can be very uncomfortable for the dog and extremely hard to remove. If your dog is groomed daily this should not be a problem.



Stock ranges from folk-art, china painting, teddy bears, cloth dolls and flower arrangements to baby clothes and many unusual novelties.







## LEGAL CORNER

#### **FIREARMS:**

Regulations made under the Prohibited Firearms Act 1996 cancel all existing licences or permits for semi-automatic firearms and pump action shotguns took effect on the 1st October, 1996. Since that date it is an offence to use these firearms, but it is lawful to possess them as there is an amnesty in force until the 1st October, 1997. People who hand in semi-automatic firearms or pump action shot guns to the collection points will receive a compensation payment on the spot. This surprisingly applies whether you previously owned the firearms legally or illegally. If you require any further information you may contact Information Victoria on 1800 136 762.

SYDNEY 2000 GAMES (INDICIA AND IMAGES) - THE PROTECTION ACT 1996

This Act, which came into operation on the 28th June, 1996, protects anyone who has take

out a licence to use words and symbols associated with the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games. The Act also authorises other to use these Olympic indicia and images. Licensed users can enforce their rights by instituting legal proceedings for and injunction, damages and corrective advertising.

#### **COMPULSORY RETIREMENT:**

Under Commonwealth legislation employers are generally prohibited from terminating an employment because of age. Employers can, however, terminate an employee's employment if it can be shown that being a particular age is "inherent requirement for a particular job"

In Victoria, discrimination on ground of age is prohibited by the Equal Opportunity Act 1995 which commenced on the 1st January, 1996. The Act also makes compulsory retirement unlawful from the 1st January, 1997.



# EXCLUSIVE AGENCY - EXCLUSIVE SERVICE

Many Vendors think that the best way to market their property is to list it with as many agents as possible. The logic is simple - more agents = more exposure.

The old wisdom less is more is worth noting here.

"Listing with lots of agents sounds good in theory but in practice it means that no one agent is motivated to go all out to sell a property because they can do a lot of groundwork only to find that another agent sells it out from under their noses.

Many vendors report that after unsuccessful experience with general listings they find out by trial and error that they are better off with an exclusive agency with a professional, active agent. Its only natural that agents will be more energetic on behalf of their own exclusive listings.

With general listings, sales occur more by good luck than by good management.

Exclusive agency means that a vendor can afford to relax knowing that there is someone who is accountable.

How do you hold lots of different agents responsible for what is happening? Who is ultimately responsible for the property being left secure or everyday instructions about pets or curtains let alone why the property isn't selling?

The important thing is to choose the right agent in the first place. Make sure you compare all the services an agent has to offer. Compare services and don't just go by price. Agents who offer the lowest commission often can't afford to offer a well structured marketing programme. It is worth noting word of mouth recommendation from someone whose opinions you respect.

In the end weigh up all the information and go with your gut feeling. If you have done your homework you should be able to sit back and look forward to first class service.
