Well before 9 O'clock there was not a parking spot to be had for streets around and people crowded Princess and High Streets.








Attention Clifton Springs residents south side of Bayshore Avenue through to Central Road, between the water and Clifton Springs Road.





### COUNCILLOR WELCOMES ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY

The former Geelong Regional Commission adopted an economic strategy for the region in 1988 - Directions, The Geelong Region Development Strategy - which had a 10-year implementation program. A community based vision for the future - Geelong 2010. A preferred Future - was also undertaken in 1994.

Over the past 18 months, the City's Economic Development Unit has been progressing a number of studies to facilitate economic growth in the Geelong region and to assist in developing an economic strategy for the City. **These studies include:** 

- Physical Infrastructure Study of City addresses telecommunication, energy, water
   Sewerage, roads and public transport
- Health Education Infrastructure
- Wool Industry Strategy
- Wool Showfloors Rationalization
- Geelong Seafood Industry Strategy
- Manufacturing Industry Action Plan.

This work has been undertaken in consultation with, and in some cases led by, the Geelong Development Board.

Other studies undertaken for the City which affect the future economic growth of the City include:

- Arterial Roads Study
- Urban Growth Strategy
- City Corporate Plan
- Rural Land Use Strategy
- Cultural Vision and Strategy
- GO Tourism 3 Year Strategic Business Plan.

It is intended that the economic strategy provides a broad direction for those city activities that

have an economic impact. It will also enable the work of the Geelong Development board and the City's Economic Development Unit to be refined to enable greater focus on pursuing initiatives that promote maximum investment and employment growth.

The Economic strategy is intended to provide the framework for other strategies of the City to ensure that they contribute to and support economic development. A key outcome of the project will be the preparation of an economic development map of the city - this would show elements such as economic growth nodes/activity centres, industrial parks and indicate the extent to which employment growth is likely to occur in these locations.

The Economic Development Strategy is a very important initiative for Council. The process of preparation of the Strategy will enable input from a broad range of organisations and regional groups. The Strategy will set the direction for economic development and economic activity in the Geelong region.

### D.A. & N.J. MORTIMER PETROLEUM

This business was purchased off Ernest Rodgers in 1960 by his daughter and son-inlaw Lex and Norma Mortimer, after Ernest Rodgers established the original business in 1922.

In 1960 the business involved general carrying, firewood, briquettes, and a small Mobil Agency. We changed direction on a number of occasions, first becoming a produce merchant, selling potatoes and peas in the Victoria Market for a period of 20 years. At the same time we contracted with the State Rivers carting fibro cement water pipes. The first contract was to cart the pipes that brought mains water to St. Leonards from the basin in Portarlington. Our biggest pipe contract was the carting of the second mains pipeline from Petterval to the Bellarine Basin. These pipes were 30 feet long; 24-inch cement lined steel and weighed one and a half tons each.

To help get the first contract, I sat on the kitchen table in our old house, and watched the pipes being stacked in the Station Yard. The pipes came down to Drysdale by train. By doing this I defeated our fellow competitors by 12 Pounds, 24 Dollars. We never missed a contract for the next ten years.

We had a crane, an ex Army Blitz, with a two-ton Fowler Crane on the back. With this, besides the contracts with the State Rivers, we carted and helped lay the pipes for the underground drainage in Clifton Springs for Willmore and Randall. We also carted the steel and gear, 800 tons, for the water storage tank in Andersons Road that supplies the water for Clifton Springs.

We also grew potatoes for a number of years until about 1990 when we decided that they were a lot of work for little return.

Our two boys, David and Chris came into the business in the late 1970's and with their additional prowess we have progressed to the stage where we are mainly dealing in petroleum products. After serving the public out of the yard for a number of years we built our Service Station some five years ago, and appreciate the many customers we serve.


David is the driving force with assistance from Chris, Jeff, his Mother and me to a lesser extent.

### IN YOUR GARDEN

Spring is drawing to a close with many of the wonderful flowering things coming to an end. It's a good time to be giving these things a bit of a haircut and a feed to encourage some growth. Flowering trees can be pruned once they have finished to encourage even growth over the tree. Young trees sometimes need to be pruned a little harder to reduce that lanky appearance, older trees only need to be pruned to grow in the shape that you want them to be.

The good news however is that the roses are well and truly on the way to looking glorious. The dry spring has meant that fungal problems like Black Spot, Rust etc. haven't been as rampant, leaving the roses lovely and free from disease. If you are having problems then it may well be the way you water. Best to water in the morning before it gets hot and onto the ground rather than on the leaves. The worst thing about this weather is that the aphids breed

like mad. These slippery little suckers remove copious amount of sap from anything that they fancy, causing distortion of the leaves, deformed flower buds and reduced growth vigour in the plant. If you don't mind the green stains on the fingers you can squeeze them, a spray of Garlic, Pyrethrum, Soapy water or a product like Malathion will usually knock them around. You will however have to do follow up sprays to ensure that they don't return.

Black Aphids seem to be prevalent so far this year and need to be controlled quickly before they can cause too much damage to Flowering trees, hibiscus, Fruit trees and the like. Leaf damage, similar in look to curly leaf is a good indication of their presence. Spray with a serious spray Malathion, Rogor or similar to quickly get rid of them, follow up applications may be required.



### SWAN BAY

### INTEGRATED CATCHMENT MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

#### **ACTION PLANS UNDERWAY**

Work has begun on the preparation of Action Plans for the protection and enhancement of Swan Bay and its Catchment.

Swan Bay is situated at the eastern end of the Bellarine Peninsula and has a catchment area of 170 square kilometres bounded by Ocean Grove, Point Lonsdale and Queenscliff, St. Leonards and the outskirts of Drysdale.

The bay is listed on the Register of the National Estate because of its very high environmental significance. The wetlands of the Swan Bay area have received international recognition due to their role in providing habitat for waterfowl and wading birds including many migratory bird species. The bay provides breeding and nursery area for fish, crustaceans, molluscs and other marine creatures. The area supports one of the three largest known populations of the endangered Orange-bellied parrot.

The Swan Bay Integrated Catchment Management Committee has prepared a draft schedule and priority listing of Action Plans

to tackle the many threats to the future well being of Swan Bay and its Catchment.

#### The Action Plans cover the areas of

- Community Awareness and Participation;
- Pest Plants and Animals;
- Remnant Vegetation and Wildlife Corridors;
- Stormwater;
- Water Quality (including Streamside Protection and Water Monitoring);
- Sustainable Agricultural Practices (including Whole Farm Planning, Catchment Plans, Salinity, Pasture Selection, Small Farm Management and a Best Farm Practice Award).

The Swan Bay Integrated Catchment Management Committee was formed to coordinate the Activities of voluntary groups working on land management and marine issues, with those of the municipalities and statutory bodies.

### USED CARS: NEW COOLING OFF PROVISIONS

In an attempt to reduce the large proportion of complaints made to consumer organisations about vehicle repairs - the proportion is currently over 20 percent - legislation has recently been passed which revises the statutory warranty system in relation to used cars and requires all registered cars to be sold with a roadworthy certificate.

The Motor Car Traders Act 1996 is now fully operational. The previous three-step warranty arrangements based on the price paid for the used car have been replaced by a system which takes into account the age and kilometres travelled. As a result:

- the warranty period for all used cars, except cars over ten years old or which have driven 160,000 kilometres, is 5000 kilometres or three months whichever comes first;
- there is no warranty if a car is more than ten years old or has driven more than 160,000 kilometres;

- a motor car trader must repair any defect appearing in the car before the end of the warranty period;
- the warranty does not apply to accidental damage which occurred after the car was delivered or to tyres, battery or any prescribed accessory of the car or to any defects specified in writing by the dealer.

#### Other provisions of the Act increase:

- the jurisdiction for complaints against traders in the Small Claims Tribunal from \$5000 to \$10,000; and
- the jurisdiction of the Credit Tribunal to hear disputes over credit contracts from \$20,000 to \$40,000.

The Act also clarifies that a clear day for the purposes of a purchaser's three day cooling-off period does not include a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday.



### GOOD VIBES SELL HOUSES

Most home sellers realise that good presentation will improve the appeal of their homes. Some are even prepared to spend up big in quest of the prestigious top dollar.

However, while attention to detail may make your house sell faster and add dollars to its price, spending a lot of money getting your home ready to sell may be a waste. Buyers don't always want to pay for improvements that are not to their taste and potential sales may be lost.

On the other hand there are still a lot of simple things you can do to make your house welcoming and attractive. Bear in mind that appeal is not just visual - other senses like hearing and smell all contribute to a purchaser's evaluation of a property.

Sensory stimuli such as noise and smell can be powerful emotional triggers and buyers could react negatively to features that are not even "fixtures" of the home.

Smokers and dog owners could burn essential oils or use room deodorisers. Unpleasant or alien odours probably have a more negative effect than any other single attribute. Conversely, inviting smells like freshly brewing coffee or hot baked cakes have a positive impact.

Loud or extraneous noises are a distraction at best and could even turn a buyer against the property.

While you won't want to change the carpet just because it may not appeal to everyone, exuberant dogs or loud music are inexpensive to keep to a minimum. Even if your buyers are dog lovers, getting involved in canine rough and tumble may distract them from the real purpose of their visit.

Most purchasers have a checklist of criteria they use to evaluate properties on a rational and critical level.

Yet they often end up making a decision based on emotion and not according to how the features match up to those on their list. Most agents will tell you they have seen purchasers fall in love with properties that don't meet all of their stated needs. Sometimes the positive effect is almost subliminal - days later people don't know why they feel more positive about your home than a similar one down the road
