

Just recently I have had cause to reflect on the state of our community and what seems to me, to be a significant shift in people's attitude to one another during my lifetime.

Maybe it's because I am older, but I try not to be too critical of my children's generation. I know that far greater intellects than mine have pontificated on this subject over the years, but the number of divorces with their attendant problems are surely a cause for concern, so too is the seeming wish to blame someone else for our problems and sue them for money if possible, not to mention the almost greedy pursuit of power and financial reward above all else.

tures on earth to relate to Him, to themselves and the other creatures placed on this earth. He grew up a dutiful son, became a carpenter, and in His late twenties began His ministry that was to last just two or three years. In that short period He changed the world for all time. His Church has reached the furthermost ends of the earth.

We give gifts to members of our own family on the occasion of their birthday and we, Christians or not, moved by the wonder and magic of it all, give gifts to loved ones on the great occasion of the Lords birthday. There are many things other than material gifts that can bring great joy to many people on Christmas Day; a word of comfort, a gesture of peace, a handshake, a few minutes of your time or even just a smile. It is not the value of the gift that matters, it is the thought that goes with it that earns the "brownie points".

Those of us who have been around somewhat longer and seen many Christmases still marvel at the joy on the faces of little children as the wonder of it all spreads it's magic around them. In your joy of giving and receiving gifts this Christmas perhaps you may spare a thought for those who need a little help.

Enjoy Christmas! remember what it's about and be thankful.

For a great meal with excellent service, maybe a quick bet and a good bottle of wine, the **Drysdale Hotel** is the place for you.







TUCKERBERRY HILL

John and Margaret Tucker invite you to call and enjoy the experience of picking your own delicious blueberries.

We are on the Murradoc Hill slopes, with a panoramic view from Melbourne to Point Nepean and everything in between, so be prepared for windy conditions.

The fruit is in season from December 26th through to the end of the season. Now that we have netted to control hungry birds the season will last two, three or even four months.

They are delicious eaten fresh, with or without cream or ice cream, or in a fruit salad. They can be cooked in muffins, cakes, puddings, pancakes, used in stuffing for meat dishes, or made into soup!

Blueberries need no peeling, no coring, and no seeding - just wash and use them. They need no washing or blanching before freezing and are used straight from the freezer without thawing.

Blueberries stay fresh in the fridge for several weeks and freeze well, and taken in the diet slow the rate of ageing due to their high level of antioxidants.

Nutritious, delicious, and so easy – blueberries are good for you too. They are rich in Vitamins A and C, and supply trace elements such as calcium, magnesium, phosphorous and potassium, while low in calories – only 42 per half cup.

CHRISTMAS TIME AT DRÝSDALE POST OFFICE

Australia Post is again providing a reduced rate of postage for cards during November and December. As an additional bonus this year there is also a reduced rate for cards being posted to overseas destinations.

Rate AUSTRALIA: 40c

Note this rate applies to Post Office Preferred standard size cards only.

Rate OVERSEAS: 80c Cards up to 20 grams.

We recommend to Post Early and spread the load for your "Postie" over the whole month.

We will be extending our hours leading up to Christmas' from 6th December, to see if we can ease some of the congestion that has occurred in previous years.

Operating hours: 8.30am - 5.30pm

All normal business can be transacted while open.

Some tips, which will help us both and allow mail to flow through the system better:

- Pack parcels well to avoid damage.
 My Staff will advise you the best
 Way to pack, if you require assistance.
- Note: We have a full range of packing materials available from Padded bags to boxes.
- * Address articles correctly.
- Put return address on all mail including Christmas cards.

Make sure all your cards have a stamp attached.

If possible bundle your cards together with an elastic band when posting or hand to counter staff.

Overseas mail will need to be posted by early December to ensure delivery before Xmas.

We have provided a special posting box for letters to SANTA. Please take the opportunity for your children to post their letters.

We would welcome you to browse at our range of products, which are suitable for Christmas gifts which range from stocking fillers to camera's. We also have a large range and style of Christmas cards priced from \$1.95.




As you amble around the 3 acres you have to keep reminding yourself that this garden is only 2 years old – and inspiration to all gardeners.

1999 has been a year of many challenges and achievements. I hope you believe as I do that the New Year and the new millennium looks bright for all of us.

That does not mean that we won't come up against hurdles from time to time. I can assure you that I will continue to work hard to represent our community at Council and focus on the ongoing growth and development of the Bellarine.

As we near the end of the year, it is timely to take a look at a couple of the projects now rapidly nearing completion.

Clifton Springs is about to take possession of its new skate park. These facilities borne from and driven by community in partnership with Council and the local police are a terrific asset. Not only does it give the kids in the community a sense of ownership, but also it provides an important safe environment in which to gather and exercise.

Construction commenced some 4 weeks ago where the site has been established. Work is progressing well and is on schedule. The site has been fully fenced off and all skaters and residents are requested to keep well clear of the construction site for safety reasons.

We are expecting completion and an official Skate Park Opening early in the New Year, I hope to see you there in your board shorts to share in the moment.

Part of Stage 1 works at The Dell have been completed with the formalisation and sealing of car parks and pedestrian access paths, installation of underground stormwater pipes and pits, bollards/barrier fencing and landscaping works.

This is really an exciting project that will be a great asset to the local community. Further works require funding in 2000/2001 financial year to install B-B-Q's, picnic tables and seats to complete Stage 1 works. External grant funding from Parks Victoria and Department of Natural Resources and Environment is also being sought for these works.

Oh, don't forget to take a dip to ease the heat over summer in the Clifton Springs pool. It will be open for another year 7 days a week from 11am until 6pm (except during inclement weather). Over the Christmas period it is only closed on Christmas Day and the season ends in about the first week of March 2000.

It has been a year of growth but I look forward to new initiatives on the Bellarine Peninsula into the new century. Once again, a happy Christmas and holiday season to you and your family.



TWO CELEBRATIONS.

Usually at this time of the year, Christians are getting ready for one of the major celebrations of the Christian calendar - Christmas. Despite all the commercialism of the world's festivities, Christians remind themselves that they celebrate the coming of Jesus Christ our Saviour into the world. They are careful not to allow a complete hijacking by non-Christian festivities of the real reason for the season. Hence we have extra services, both inside and outside the walls of the church and we do our best to present the true cause for celebration. Not all the trees, Christmas shopping, the annual pumped up "good will to all men" slogan, the unusual display of sugary movies on television can mask the fact that Christmas is a time when we are reminded that God decided to "invade" planet earth with His own plan of salvation. So the man we call Jesus, "God with a human body", came to identify with the human race and its suffering and, if we will receive Him, deliver us from the fear of no future and no eternity. Christians are truly grateful for the coming of Christ and so we celebrate it with thanksgiving.

However this year we have cause for two celebrations. If we discount the arguments about when the new millennium begins, (some say the year 2000, some say 2001), our second celebration is to recognise that this year we can celebrate 2000 years since the coming of Jesus. Just as Christmas and Easter belong to the Christian Church, so the year 2000 is also a Christian celebration. We must not allow this time to pass us by and hand the celebrations over to a world where many have

rejected the Christ of the Gospels. Whenever we write the year in full we add the two initials A.D. from the Latin, Anno Domini meaning, "in the year of our Lord". If the year 2000 is nothing else, it is a reminder that it has been two thousand years since Christ was born and that His mission was accomplished for all time.

In John Gospel chapter 1:12, there is a very sad verse and yet a verse which ends with great promise. It speaks of the 1st Century response to Jesus by those He especially came to save. "He came to his own people but they didn't want him. But whoever did want him, who believed he was who he claimed and would do what he said, He made to be their true selves, their child-of God selves."

If we really want to find our true selves for Christmas and the new millennium, we need to discover and welcome into our lives the One who gives the full meaning to our celebrations, Jesus Christ of Christmas and the millennium. This world is not going to last forever. Nor are we and for each of us eternity lies ahead. Christ came to open the Kingdom of Heaven to those who will receive Him. The Innkeeper had no room for Him in the inn that first Christmas night. Thousands of others since have denied Him lodgings in their lives. But what about you? He still knocks on the door of our lives and asks to come in.

Why not make this Christmas and the millennium the time when you admit Him to the inn of your lives. Then you will have cause for a third celebration – your own personal encounter with eternal life right now.

May God bless you all for Christmas and the new millennium.






With many new initiatives being undertaken and the resources of an on ground paid officer the committee is confident that this target will be achieved.






