INFORMATION KIT FOR NEW RESIDENTS IS LAUNCHED

New and established residents turned out to help Springdale Community Cottage launch their new initiative – the New Residents Kit.

On Wednesday the 21st of July a kit for New Residents, produced by Springdale Community Cottage, was launched by Cr Rob Binnie and Hon Elaine Carbines MLC.

The New Residents Kit has been a special project of Springdale Community Cottage, made possible by a grant from the City of Greater Geelong; the efforts of local real estate agents, local schools and community organizations and, as always, the many free hours contributed by our faithful volunteers.

Springdale Community Cottage over the last few years, especially since the local council amalgamations, has been inundated by enquiries from new local residents for information about the services and supports available to people living on the North Bellarine Peninsula.

Adrian Mannix OAM, the President of Springdale Community Cottage commented at the launch "Springdale Community Cottage identified a need in our local community and following extensive discussion with new residents developed the idea for this Kit. We believe it will become an essential guide for all people moving to the North Bellarine Peninsula."

The New Residents Kit contains vital information about the services provided by Springdale, local schools, local service clubs, sporting groups, other commu-

nity organizations and Council. It will be distributed free of charge by local real estate agents and is also available from Springdale Community Cottage.

Springdale Community Cottage intends to continue to update the information contained in the kit at least once a year and hopes that local businesses will get behind the kit to ensure its future.

Cr Rob Binnie praised the initiative of Springdale Community Cottage in producing this important Kit "this Kit will play an important role in not only assisting new residents settle into their community but also as a tool to promote the North Bellarine Peninsula as a 'Beautiful Place to Live and Visit".

The Hon Elaine Carbines MLC indicated the State Governments support for the work of Neighbourhood Houses, like Springdale Community Cottage, in building strong local communities. "this Kit is an example of the important role Neighbourhood Houses can play in building communities across Victoria. I intend to encourage other local communities to pick up on this initiative."


DRYSDALE COMMUNITY HALL

UPDATE ON THE GST & SPRINGDALE COMMUNITY COTTAGE SERVICES

As Springdale Community Cottage is a non-profit charity we have been advised that we can apply a couple of special rules to assist in reducing the number of services that we need to charge the GST.

We believe that we will not need to charge GST on the following services:

- · Advertising in the Messenger
- · Most of our classes and courses
- Most of our room and Drysdale Hall rental charges
- Occasional Childcare; 3 year old Kindergarten program

- 3 year old Playgroup
- Toy Library
- · Springdale membership fees
- Photocopying
- Personal use of our computer facilities including internet access
- Participation fees for our Craft groups and Arthritic swimmers

GST may apply to the following:

- · Course manuals and materials
- Some courses provided by GATE (Geelong Adult Training and Education)

This is still subject to a final ruling from the Australian Taxation Office. We have, however, decided not to impose the GST on those services that we believe will not be subject to the GST. We retain the right to collect the GST on these services if, at a later date, the ATO ruling is contrary to our current advice.

PORTARLINGTON GYMNASTICS CLUB

Portarlington Gymnastics Club Incorporated has been operating for approximately 11 years and began when some parents found a lack of such activity in the Bellarine area. Over the years, due to an increase in the number of children attending and the need to have a wider range of equipment, the Club moved and now runs from Parks Hall, Newcombe Street, Portarlington on Thursday morning and after school. The Club is completely parent run and relies on fees and fund-raising to cover the cost of hall hire, insurance fees, coaches fees and update and buying of new equipment. Our coaches are fully qualified Victorian Gymnastics Association instructors and very experienced. They have developed a terrific rapport with all children over their many years affiliated with the Club.

The three morning classes cater for children from 18 months to school age and run for 50 minutes. Each class begins with a small show and tell session, music and dance and then on to the equipment where, under supervision, they are provided with the knowledge to assist them in co-ordination, strength and flexibility. The children are encouraged to try all of the equipment available, including bars, beams, ladders, wedges (for forward/backward rolls), trampolines, hoops etc. In the first class, where the children tend to be younger, we request that a parent or guardian be present to assist their child around the circuit and on the equipment. This also allows for bigger class sizes. In the two other morning classes, parents are able to view their child's progress as we currently have two teachers for these classes so that more time is able to be spent with each child to further enhance their skills.

Our after school classes have been divided into three sections (although we are more than happy to accommodate you if the class chosen for your child does not suit because of time etc.) The Recreational class runs for 50 minutes and is suitable for those just beginning in gymnastics and also for those children coming up from the morning classes. The Gymstar class runs for 1 hour 20 minutes and would appeal to the older children who, as well as learning gymnastics sills, will also have a fun time, but in a controlled atmosphere. The Level 1 class also runs for 1 hour 20 minutes and this class is specifically designed for those



children wanting to really develop their skills, tearn beam, bar, vault and floor routines and to assist them when entering competitions at our club and also at other Clubs.

Your child will have a great opportunity to enjoy themselves in a group atmosphere, test their skills on all equipment, learn discipline (both physical and mental), being able to use these skills in every day situations, but our main aim is for the children to have FUN. The Club is geared towards the children having a terrific time and also learning many skills, which they may not otherwise have been introduced to.

Each term runs for 8 weeks and we would invite you to contact our President, Mrs. Vicky Dean on 52 513004 or our Enrolment Officer, Mr. Danielle Budge on 52 591399 if you require any further information or if you wish to make enrolment enquiries. We have made our fees as affordable as possible and restrict our fund-raising to a minimum. For new members enrolling, the first class is free and is used as an introduction to your child to the class.

So please, come along and join in the fun at the Portarlington Gymnastics Club.

NEW COMBINED PROBUS CLUB OF CLIFTON SPRINGS/ DRYSDALE

The Rotary Club of Drysdale conducted an interest meeting at the "Springs" on 30th May with a view to establishing a combined (Men's & Women's) Probus club in the area. A steering committee was formed to organise a foundation meeting to be held at "The Springs Centre" on Monday July 10th at 9.30 a.m.

A Probus club is a local association of **Professional & Business** people who are retired or semi-retired. The club meets monthly for fellowship/morning tea/short business session and to hear a guest speaker. Outings, excursions/tours and interest groups are arranged between meetings. The club is not a fundraising body and members pay only a small joining fee and annual subscription.

Probus was first established in England in 1965 and now functions in 15 countries throughout the world. It

IN YOUR GARDEN

Bare rooted season is now in full swing with a complete range of Fruit and Ornamental trees along with roses of all sorts. A Winter range of bulbs are now available with liliums, gladioli, not to mention the tried and true strawberry, rhubarb, asparagus and seed potatoes. This leaves you with little option but to get to work in the garden while all these goodies are available. With any luck you may even generate enough heat while you are digging to keep you warm.

Even though we have had some quite welcome rain, don't completely forget about watering the garden. Plants that live under the eaves or on the east side of the house can still be

suffering from water stress because the rain is not getting there. A casual scrape of the soil as you walk past, will always give you an indication of any pressing need for man made precipitation. Remember that we are still a long way short of our normal rainfall over a period of time, so the ground has to soak a lot in to make up the shortfall.

This time of the year always makes the husbands of the world happy. They finally get to have their revenge on those horrid thorny things that have been ripping at them all year. No, not the wife, the ROSES!! Pruning of roses can be started this month but ideally towards the end of it. Muzzles and leads are essential for controlling the mad scramble to repay for past wounds. Fortunately roses are very tough and will withstand quite severe pruning, as long as there is something to grow back from. The theory is cut to a bud pointing the way you want the rose to grow, remove the dead or diseased bits, while cutting about half of the bush off. It's a rule of thumb, some people are harder and some not so hard, after you have done it a few times you tend to develop your own method that works for you.

Some of the members went to see "The Sound of Music" on Wednesday June 7th. Our trip organiser has many interesting places to visit during the rest of the year.



THE CHARISMA FACTOR

Buyers and sellers alike wonder why apparently similar houses sell for different prices.

Two houses of equal size and condition in the same street can have very different market appeal.

It often comes down to what can best be summed up in terms of a gestalt principle or the relationship between the whole and the sum of the parts. Sometimes the whole is greater than a mere sum of the parts - - but sometimes, unfortunately, it is less.

The effect of the superior property is similar to that special human quality labelled charisma.

Charisma is hard to define but as far as houses are concerned it can be as simple as the overall impression created by regular maintenance and attention to detail in the presentation of the property.

However, it is more likely to be a function of the original design concept of the house. Many people like to think they are saving money at the planning stage and wonder why their house doesn't end up having the impact they imagined. Good design, especially the skilful use of natural light, window placement and the correct orientation of the property adds something you can recognise but can't always define.

Many people add on, or make minor changes as the need arises without taking a holistic view of their property.

They think in terms of immediate solutions and a particular problem area of the house rather than conceptualising the impact of the house as a whole.

In the worst cases money is spent and features are added but market appeal is negligibly enhanced. For example extending without reference to the scale of the home creates an effect that is not harmonious or flowing as a design concept and lacks the market appeal of other houses with the same number of features on paper.

When decorating, extending or renovating remember charisma adds to the capital value of your home.

If the proposed changes add features only, chances are you won't have maximised your market potential.
