awesome," she says. So at fourteen, started flying with the Bacchus Marsh School of Aviation.

Samantha joined 28 Flight-Geelong AIRTC (air cadets), in March 1992 where she stayed until mov-

ing to Canberra, and would strongly encourage all young people from twelve/thirteen to join a youth organization, be it army, navy, air cadets, scouts, guides etc. "Not only did I learn heaps about marching, military protocol, aircraft recognition, etc., I experienced the thrill of abseiling, flying, bush survival and so much more. It was so much fun, plus I made some very good mates."

After graduating from the Defence Force Academy, Samantha spent six months working at Defence Force Recruiting in Sydney, before joining No. 183 Pilots Course at Raaf Base Pearce, W.A. She concedes "the past 14 months have been gruelling, it's been a pretty hard slog

all the way. But now I know, at the end of the day I'm going to fly tomorrow, which is most definitely worth all the study and sleepless nights. There is absolutely nothing to compare with my job, it is positively awesome!!"

Samantha graduated with fifteen other pilots, nine of whom will fly the new Hawk lead-in fighter jet trainer due to enter service next year to replace the Macchi. The other pilots have been posted to fly the HS748 aircraft, the Falcoln 900, P3C Orion, Carboux. In another first for the air force, two pilots have been posted to the army for a two-year helicopter exchange.

Samantha together with another pilot have been posted for three years to fly the C130 Hercules aircraft at RAAF Base Richmond, Sydney.

Outside of her flying interests, time permitting, Samantha enjoys horse riding and playing the saxophone.

Congratulations Samantha, you are a credit to your community and we're proud of you!

The Royal Australian Air Force has a new high flyer. On the 25th August this year Flying Officer Samantha Webster was the first woman in three years to graduate as a RAAF pilot, making her the eleventh female air force pilot nationally.

Samantha was raised in Clifton Springs/Drysdale and attended Drysdale Primary School. After completing her secondary schooling at Sacred Heart College in Geelong. she was accepted into the Australian Defence Force Academy - Canberra in 1996, where she completed a Bachelor of Science degree majoring in geography.

When she was nine, she had her first look inside a cockpit. "It was

R. & S.L.'s HIGHEST HONOUR TO DRYSDALE MAN

Early in December last year the National Executive of the R.&S.L. endorsed a recommendation from the Victorian Branch Awards Committee and awarded Mr. George Malcolm, current Secretary of The Drysdale R.&S.L. sub-branch, the Meritorious Service Medal. This is the League's highest honor. Even to be considered for this Award the Nominee must hold Life Membership and have had at least thirty years Continuous membership including twenty-five years of outstanding service to the League.

George has comfortably met all these requirements and is the first Geelong district Member to be so honoured.

When announcing the Award at the Drysdale Sub-branch Christmas Luncheon Mr. John Zula, State Councilor and deputy Chairman of the District Board, outlined George's record of service.

A smaller lapel badge was also awarded and George's name will be included on a special honor board at ANZAC House in Melbourne.

George himself, though justly proud of his award, says it is also a recognition of the work of a small country sub-branch, which, despite their dwindling numbers, continue to uphold the real values and traditions of The League.

State President, Bruce Ruxton, is reported to have added to his words of congratulations, "Here is a bloody good man and a bloody good Member of the R.&.S.L.".



WALLINGTON PRIMARY SCHOOL CENTENARY

Wallington Primary School is this year celebrating 100 years of educating the local community.

Although Wallington was first opened in 1866 with an enrolment of 26 pupils the school was forced to close soon after as the Board of Education refused funding.

Wallington was then re-opened on January 22nd, 1900 when the disused Newington School (one schoolroom and a two-room residence) was shifted to a one-acre site donated by J.G. Carr with Margaret Stapleton in charge of 25 pupils. The building was replaced in 1957 (it is currently abandoned on an allotment in Belcher's Road near the current Bellarine Secondary College

campus) by a single room to which another room was added in 1966.

Since then Wallington has grown to have 6 classrooms with 133 students. During 1998 a modern multimedia centre was added to the main building.

The Wallington hall opened in 1932 and was used for dances every fortnight. A flower and fruit show was held in 1936, 1937 and 1938. An extension was built on the hall In June 1986, the in 1953. Wallington Hall Committee handed over an \$80,000 donation to the Shire of Bellarine towards the construction of the hall at the Wallington Reserve on Wallington Road.

After 1986, Vic Roads and the Education Department came to an agreement allowing the school to lease the hall for school use. The hall now forms an integral part of the school program being used as both an Art room and a Cultural Resource Centre.

Wallington's school bell was donated by Father Mannise and came from St. Thomas's Catholic Church at Drysdale in 1965. The bell (which still heralds the start and end of lessons) is believed to be over 100 years old and is now housed in a tower constructed by families from the school.

Recently the Minister for Local Government, the Hon Bob Cameron, approved Council's decision to return to a one-tier system of Govern-

I firmly believe that this is right way to go for Geelong's future.

The current two-tier system is not working. In fact, I believe the current tension that surfaces between Councillors is a direct result of the inadequacies of the system to cope with the task.

The new system will bring many benefits to the residents of the City of Greater Geelong.

It will reduce the power, manipulation, and big political parties in local government. It will also reduce the ability of one single interest group to influence individual councillors. Councillors who are not at the beck and call of pressure groups will better represent residents.

This is the way forward if we want to bring an end to elitism while restoring democracy to local government. It will also give all councillors equal status and workload and will provide every resident an opportunity to stand for election if they wish.

I look forward to the new system putting the 'local' back in local government. For the community it will bring equal representation and equal access to councillors. My ward currently contains some 44,000 residents. With that number, I can't possibly attend to all residents' issues no matter how many hours I put in.

Importantly, the new system will return accountability to Council. Each elected representative will be more accountable to those who vote them into office.

But perhaps the most important benefit of all will be the empowerment of community until the single tier system with 12 councillors. I look forward to our community sharing in the benefits of this 'smart move' for Geelong.





IN YOUR GARDEN

We are well and truly into the changed season, Spring is upon us and it feels good. Winter flowering things have finished their flowering. making way for the brilliance of Spring flowering plants. Instead of throwing away the masses of dead Camellia flowers use them in your compost. Daffodils will be finishing their flowering soon and you need to resist the temptation to whip them off at the socks. A good feeding with whatever is about and leave the flower stalks on for as long as you can stand looking at them. The goodness will be absorbed by the bulb as it sets flowers for next year.

The Daphne has pretty much finished flowering now but the boronias are just getting going. The heady aroma of the brown and vellow Boronia is just wonderful. Some people find them difficult to grow. but they do survive well in a pot as long as they have water and either morning or filtered sun. In the ground they prefer to be moist but not sitting in water, a regular feed of low phosphorus food keeps them happy as does not too much hot sun. They are worth a try even if it is just for the bunches of flowers to put in the house to make it smell nice.

As the weather heads towards warm, as averse to freezing, the new seedling releases start to pop up. There are many new hybrids of the tried and true varieties available this year, in all sorts of colours and sizes. When choosing the right ones, look for nice strong plants with the colours that will suit your spot. Don't be too afraid to experiment with some new ones, even if it is just in a little patch. Most importantly don't feed them to the snails, feed the snails some pellets and keep your seedlings for yourself.



INCLUDE AMBULANCE IN ASTHMA PLAN

"Rural Ambulance Victoria should be included in any management plan being developed by asthmatics and their families," Area 1 Senior Operations Officer Clinical Mick Cameron said today.

"Any asthma attack can be potentially fatal, and should be treated as an emergency. As in any emergency, the Ambulance should be called immediately."

Mr. Cameron said doctors and pediatricians were warning that pollens could worsen asthma symptoms and urging sufferers and their families to make asthma management plans.

"Rural Ambulance Victoria supports the use of asthma action plans, but wants asthmatics to be aware that we provide a range of services for patients that have breathing disorders, especially Asthma," said Mr. Cameron.

"Asthma is becoming more prevalent in our communities, and it's important that people understand the triggers for their asthma. These can include air pollution, respiratory allergies and numerous other trigger factors."

Mr. Cameron said Rural Ambulance Victoria treated all asthma cases with a high priority and always dispatched an ambulance as an emergency response.

"In the vast majority of cases, ambulance treatment provides immediate improvement in the symptoms of asthma and in some cases can be a life saver, so phoning for an Ambulance should be the first contact point by any asthma sufferer in distress."

"Asthma is potentially life threatening. Oxygen and medication carried and administered by highly trained professional Ambulance paramedics can see asthma sufferers quickly and safely receive the treatment and immediate transport they may need."

"Remember, include Rural Ambulance Victoria in any asthma management plan, as our assistance in an emergency can sometimes mean the difference between life and death."

Mr. Cameron said the number to call for an ambulance anywhere in Victoria was 000.







RENTAL REFERENCE KNOWHOW

Everybody knows how to check a tenant's references. Don't they? After all, secure tenancy forms the foundation of successful investment.

In fact, it's often a case of a little knowledge is a dangerous thing.

Many people don't know which questions to ask and how to analyse the information they end up with. Investors need to feel confident their property manager is experienced – after all, maximising investment income is entirely dependent upon keeping arrears, vacancies and repairs and maintenance to a minimum and yield and capital appreciation at a maximum.

The two most important background checks are previous rental history and employment record.

This sounds straightforward but there are many traps for the inexperienced – it comes down to knowing what the information means in terms of tenant performance.

For example, tenants might pay their rent up to date upon vacating but might have been a problem during the tenancy. Or someone might be in full time employment for many years and still not be a good tenant. One or two factors are insufficient to build up a profile of the prospective tenant.

But too much information might see someone turning away potentially good tenants and ending up with a longer vacancy. Landlords managing for themselves often get too involved to be impartial.

The mistake most inexperienced people make is to rely on personal references.

In all my years of managing property I have never seen a bad personal reference.

Friends and relatives just don't write negative things about those close to them and even if they do, prospective tenants are not going to offer bad references to landlords or agents.
