

Adrian E Mannix Community Service Awards 2003 Nominations

The Adrian E. Mannix Award was established in 2002 by the Lions and Rotary Clubs and supported by SpringDale Neighbourhood Centre, to recognize the voluntary contributions of local residents to their local community.

Although only one person can be a winner, all the nominees are worthy of this Award. These people do not ask for accolades or recognition but by bringing the significant contributions these people have made to our attention, we are able to show them our appreciation.

(Please note the Nominees are listed in alphabetical order)

Nominee: Merrilyn Anderson

In 1992 Merrilyn was elected as the Honorary Secretary of the Portarlington Development Association. During the nine years she served as Secretary she was closely involved with the Pier Development, Adventure Park behind Parks Hall, Fiesta and Seafood barbeque. Retention of Police residence, the Inaugural Natural Gas Committee, Community Day Expo held in Parks Hall in 1998 and supported the young people seeking to obtain a skate park in the town. In 1998 Merrilyn became one of the key people working towards the establishment of a Community Bank in Portarlington, and in 1999 Merrilyn assisted with arranging the Inaugural Line Dancing Long Weekend held in Portarlington during March.

Nominee: Jocelyn Banks

Jocelyn's selfless & unobtrusive devotion to her community includes the Environment: - weed removal for Landcare & Edwards Point and care of newly planted trees by school children (all ongoing), Animals: -both domestic and native (which she is helping to reinstate in a protected environment at Lara) as well as support for our elderly persons in transition to Aged Care, and volunteer receptionist at Health Link on Thursdays. Additionally, Jocelyn is a volunteer fundraiser for the Anti-Cancer Council, the Children's Hospital Appeal and Cottage by the Sea.

Nominee: Kay Butler

Kay has run the Portarlington Scout's Secondhand Bookstore 6 days a week for the last 18 months. She volunteered her services although she had no affiliation to Scouts. Kay has cleaned, sorted & reorganized the bookshop, with her work increasing sales. This has enabled the Scouts to replace camping equipment, and recruit young children to attend scouting activities, something that they otherwise would not be able to afford.

Nominee: Jean Cull

Jean has led by example in caring for the young and the aged. She was the first female Councilor in the Bellarine Shire, serving for 6 years. Jean has held positions in fund raising for the building of Ann Nichol House and continues voluntary work with "The Friends" of Ann Nichol House. A Wing at A.N.H was named Jean Cull in recognition of her commitment. A Foundation member & current President of Ann Nichol House for 9 years, Jean has also been a Justice of the Peace for 26 years and Guide leader at Portarlington & St. Leonards for 9 years.

Nominee: Pam Davis

Pam joined Drysdale R.S.L. in 1967 and has been an active member of the Women's Auxiliary for 35 years - 33 years on Committee as an Office Bearer. She also has 10 years service in Bellarine Health Service, volunteers for the Drysdale Auxiliary Meals on Wheels and became a Life Member of the Drysdale Football Club in 1987.

Pam works untiringly for anything she is involved in, is dependable, has a lovely quiet personality, and does so much good without fuss. Pam is held in high esteem in the Drysdale area.

Nominee: Robert Gibb

Robert has been a Volunteer Member for the Gas Committee, Ambulance Committee, Probus Club of Portarlington, past member Lions Club of Portarlington/Drysdale, Sailing School - R.G.Y.C., Port Report, and Secretary for the Portarlington Mill. He has also been the Volunteer Auditor for the Tennis Club - Jengaleers &SES and Barwon Bulldogs.

His Fund Raising Projects (Through Garage Sales -Big Shed. Portarlington) have raised money for the Skate Park, SES, Leukaemia Fund (Bluey Day), Baycity Concords and Portarlington Toy Library. Robert is a Volunteer Worker for the Street Lights for Christmas, Guides Portarlington, Bluey Bay (Golf Club) and the Bellarine Agricultural Show, as well as being Santa Claus for the Fire Brigade, Carols by Candlelight Portarlington & St. Leonards and Barwon Bulldogs.

Nominee: Trevor Hockley

Syd Payne's list of community involvements over many years include: - Scouting, assisting St. John's Ambulance & Red Cross. With the Geelong Football Umpires League he was Field Umpire, Assistant Coach helping young umpires, fundraiser and put in 200 hours building the first Clubrooms, becoming Life Member in 1962. He is Past President of the Indented Head Powerboat & Angling Club, saved 5 people from drowning, did fund- raising for Clubrooms and attended distress calls at night. At the Lions Club of Portarlington/Drysdale he has 26 vears perfect attendance, was an instigator of Bellarine Elderly Peoples Homes known as Lions Village, putting in many hours on

fundraising activities, and is currently Lion Tamer. Other associations include: Barwon Masonic Lodge, Indented Head Boat Club, Volunteer Air Show Downunder, Bellarine Mark Masonic Lodge, St. Albans Football Club, Portarlington Probus, and Foundation Member of Bayview Probus Club.

Nominee: John Robb

John was a Scout Group Leader for 10 years (1988-1998) with 5 years as District Commissioner from 1998. During his years as Group Leader of Drysdale Scouts, John has spent countless hours overseeing the running of Cubs, Scouts, and Venturers as well as the recruiting, training and management of Leaders & Committees. The past 5 years as District Commissioner for Geelong Peninsula District shows John's commitment to youth in Scouting in our area.

Nominee: John Rule

John co-ordinates and participates in a singing/band group called the Troubadours. Over 2002 they entertained (at no cost) 60 Aged Care Centres within our area. The work John and his team do has brought happiness to a lot of lonely aged citizens and has broken the sometimes dull existence of living in an Aged Care Centre. They and John especially, spend many dollars in these productions.

Nominee: Lesley Taylor

Lesley's Volunteer Contributions include: Drysdale & District Health Centre (Since it began), Drysdale Football Club, Drysdale Community Crafts (Treasurer), Drysdale Fire Brigade, Drysdale Cricket Club, Uniting Church Drysdale, Geelong Hospital Auxiliary, Drysdale Primary School, Needy Families Xmas Appeal and Meals on Wheels in the Drysdale/Clifton Springs area

In many of the above areas Lesley is involved with catering - her cakes etc. are delicious. Lesley has lived in this district all her life. She is quiet and unassuming, but always ready to help anyone. As a member of Drysdale Fire Brigade (before it was automated) she had the task of ringing the bell to alert firemen and residents that there was a fire and they should attend immediately. She has given exemplorary service to many organizations in the district and is a public-spirited person indeed.






the girls dressing up for parties and feeding their babies before they go out



PRAISE FOR NEW LIFE SAVING INITATIVE

The Australian Resuscitation Council (Victorian Branch) today congratulated the Victorian Government, Rural Ambulance Victoria and Metropolitan Ambulance Service on the introduction of the new Public Access Defibrillation (PAD) pilot program announced today by the Victorian Minister for Health Ms. Bronwyn Pike.

"This exciting initiative has the potential to significantly improve survival from cardiac arrest in public places such as shopping centres, tourist facilities and sporting venues" said Australian Resuscitation Council (Victorian Branch) Chairman Mr. Tony Walker.

Survival rates from out of hospital cardiac arrests have been traditionally poor (3-5%), however studies have shown that the initiatives

such as the Public Access Defibrillation program announced today, can see these survival rates increase to more than 70% in public venues.

The Australian Resuscitation Council, and its member organisations, recognised the importance of early defibrillation programs such as Public Access Defibrillation, and have been actively working with State and Federal Government in the development of initiatives to reduce the time to defibrillation and improve survival from cardiac arrest.

Cardiac arrest is a leading cause of death in Victoria and usually occurs due to an irregular heart rhythm. This rapidly leads to collapse, loss of circulation and death if not treated quickly, with a 10% reduction in survival that a victim remains untreated.

"A cardiac arrest is treated by administering an electric shock to the heart using a defibrillator. In the past defibrillators were only able to be used by health professionals such as Paramedics, Doctors and nurses. however this life saving skill is now able to be provided by first aiders with minimal training using Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs)" Mr. Walker said.

"An AED automatically analyses a victims heart rhythm and advises the operator through voice and visual prompts to push a button to deliver a shock if required. They are simple to use, extremely safe and will not allow inappropriate or unnecessary shocks to be delivered" Mr. Walker said.

"There is no doubt that the introduction of EAD as part of a coordinated Emergency Medical Services system can save lives" Mr. Walker said.





BEWARE OF HEAT AND SMOKE

Rural Ambulance Victoria is urging the community to take basic precautions to avoid heat-related injuries and illnesses, and respiratory difficulties caused by bushfire smoke.

"As temperatures climb, we experience an increase in the number of patients suffering directly from the heat," said Clinical and Education Services Manager, Tony Walker.

"Most of the time it's the elderly and people suffering from existing illness who are affected by the host weather. However, heat related difficulties can often be prevented by people taking appropriate precautions".

"It's common sense to stay out of the direct sun during the hottest part of the day and the impact of the heat can be reduced by staying indoors, wearing light clothing and using an air conditioner or fan".

Mr. Walker said people should also maintain their body's fluid levels by drinking plenty of water, rather than just tea or coffee, as these drinks can reduce the body's fluid levels.

"We also advise elderly people to try to limit the amount of exercise they have during hotter weather".

Mr. Walker said on heat related issue that caused concern for Rural Ambulance Victoria was parents leaving children in cars.

"It is so important that parents do not leave children in cars, particularly on hot days".

"The sun beating down on a car can result in a very rapid rise in the vehicle's internal temperature, which can quickly cause a child to dehydrate".

"If left untreated, the child could die".

Mr. Walker has also renewed the warning for people with respiratory illnesses, who could be affected by smoke from the bushfires.

"The smoke could easily trigger or worsen bouts of respiratory distress such as Asthma and chest infections", said Rural Ambulance Victoria's senior clinician Tony Walker, "and could make breathing difficult for those people in the community with respiratory problems, especially the elderly".

"We are urging anyone with respiratory problems to remain indoors as much as possible, and to use any medications they have for their condition according to directions".

Mr. Waker said anyone experiencing breathing problems not relieved by their medication should dial 000 and request urgent ambulance attendance.





WHAT DO THE LOCALS SAY?
