It's been a busy year so far. Our first group for the year has just returned from Peru. Lesley and I went to Kuala Lumpur in February for the International Conference where both stores excelled in receiving awards. Jean is off now with our next group to Vietnam and Cambodia. My husband, Glenn and I have also just been on our annual trip to Tassie where this time we stayed at beautiful Freycinet Lodge. Peru was amazing. The coastal des-

From Puno we took a boat to the floating Uros Indian Villages on Lake Titicaca. One of the most beautiful drives in the world is between Puno and Cuzco. Amazing views

and the road reached 4800 metres. From Cuzco we traveled out to the Sacred Valley, did some fantastic shopping at the Pisac market and then caught the train up to the Machu Picchu. It was cloudy and a little wet up on the mountain and that added to mysterious atmosphere. It was a wonderful trip and made even more special by the friendships made with the small group experience.

Bellarine Seniors Register

Members of the Portarlington Community Association have proposed this very exciting project for Bellarine – the establishment of a Seniors Register.

There are Seniors Registers in several

areas of Victoria, including Rosebud, Waverley, Oakleigh and Shepparton, all working in slightly different ways, but all run by volunteers in conjunction with local Police.

Older, vulnerable people within the communities register vital information and contact details and if they wish can have regular contact from a volunteer. In this way people, particularly those who are isolated through ill health, frailty or disability, are connected into their communities.

Local and regional Police, including Senior Sgt. Gary Coombes, the new officer in charge at Bellarine Police Station, were keen to discuss the idea further and a meeting is planned to begin to look at the detail of how such a Register could be established for Bellarine.

I will of course keep you posted on the process as it develops, including consultation with the relevant organisations and agencies across the Bellarine Peninsula. Mobile Office at SpringDale

Throughout the year, as in past years, I will be holding mobile offices across Bellarine. They have proven very popular, particularly with those of you who have difficulty getting in to see me at the electorate office in Newcomb.

Bellarine Community Health is a Community Health Service that has developed as a significant primary care service. It was formed in 1992 from the amalgamation of the Drysdale, Portarlington and Queenscliff community health services. Bellarine Community Health is a major provider of community based primary health and aged residential care services on the Bellarine Peninsula (Drysdale/ Clifton Springs, Portarlington, Indented Head, St. Leonards, Queenscliff/ Point Lonsdale, Barwon Heads and Ocean Grove).

Bellarine Community Health provides its services through four community health centres, a house in one township, two aged care facilities and in people's homes. There are 100 low care beds, including 20 Dementia Specific. Bellarine Community Health provides accommodation through 16 independent living units.

A strength of Bellarine Community Health has been to focus on community participation at all levels. This results in Bellarine Community Health setting the strategic directions to meet changing needs and demands.

Bellarine Community Health has a strong membership and volunteer base of over 1100 which increases to grow annually.

Fostering a Childs Future



There are many stories highlighted within the community about children and families and the happy experiences and times that they share together. Unfortunately not all children within our area are able to enjoy such closeness with their family. Mercy Children's Services is a part of MacKillop Family Services in Geelong. We are an agency that provides foster care services to children who temporarily cannot live at home with their family. Examples of why the children are not at home range from a parent who is sick and unable to

care for their child, to a child who has suffered abuse within their family.

Children in care face many issues including the loss and grief of being separated from their families, friends and homes and the trauma associated with child abuse.

Foster families care for children within their own home. They are required to respond to the needs of children in care and do an amazing job in meeting the unique needs of children and creating change within their lives.

Foster Parents are voluntary and receive a small reimbursement for having a child in care. Many Foster Parents talk about receiving many rewards from assisting a child to move on with their life. At the same time foster parenting can be very challenging.

The recruitment of foster parents is an ongoing challenge and we are keen to recruit new carers for our region which


covers the Geelong area, Surfcoast and Colac. If you feel that you may be able to help by providing foster care to children or would like further information

Drysdale - Clifton Springs Community Association Inc. Quarterly Meeting Report.

The Drysdale - Clifton Springs Community Association Inc. held its' Quarterly Meeting at the Drysdale Fire Brigade Rooms Princess St. on Wednesday 1st March. Some forty people attended.

President Wayne Elliott welcomed attendees and briefly outlined the major areas of work that had been undertaken by the Committee Members since the last meeting.

Reports as follows;

Bernard Filbay - The Clifton Springs **Foreshore Advisory Committee**

Bernard reported that this would be his last report in relation to the foreshore at Clifton Springs. The City of Greater Geelong had dissolved the Committee after ten years of skilled volunteer service despite the fact that less than half the project had been completed. Although the existing Committee Members strongly objected to this move, through the City CEO and Cr. O'Connor, the indication is that the City will not entertain re-establishment under the original 1996 Terms of Reference, nor would the Council resource any replacement Committee. He thanked everyone for their support over the past ten years and wished all well in any future efforts in regard to the improvement of the foreshore.

Paul Jones - Youth Activities.

Paul reported that the main repairs to the Skate Park had been finished.

Directional signs for public toilets at Clifton Springs Tennis Club area are in place. He will continue to work in conjunction with local young people in the area, Drysdale Police, SpringDale and Tim McDonald - City of Greater Geelong on all matters brought to The Associations attention.

Carl Schoemaker – Bellarine Strategic Plan Community Representative.

The Bellarine Strategic Plan meetings first started in late 2004. The main Committee made up of representatives of the Townships, Rural Areas and Tourism was established in 2005 and meet on the 2nd Tuesday of the month at the Potato Shed. It is envisaged that the Chairperson, Cr. Farrell, will table the completed document at the City of Greater Geelong Council meeting in April 2006.

The survey circulated in October in this area received 300 replies and these are being converted into a report and summary sheet. The main items of concern for local residents were The Dell, The Pool, Recreational Facilities, Traffic, Parking, Footpaths, Public Transport (Peninsula Wide), Green Belts and future Development.

The 1992 Structure Plan for this area will NOT be changed through the Strategic Plan Process

Sergeant Ralph Cornell - Drysdale Neighbourhood Watch.

The new Drysdale Neighbourhood Watch will be established at a meeting to be held at The Community Hall on Thursday 30th. March at 7.30 if there is sufficient community interest and attendance. One area of Clifton Springs has a most successful, hardworking group and, although a previous effort failed to establish a Drysdale group, it is hoped this effort supported strongly by the local Police and The Community Association will succeed. The Serious Crime Rate in the area is low and Sergeant Cornell believes that the establishment of Neighbourhood Watch in the area will help to keep it that way.

Tim McDonald - Introduction of Customer service Staff City of Greater Geelong.

City of Greater Geelong Customer Service Coordinator Tim McDonald introduced Vickie Harris - Customer Service Team Leader and Melissa Evans – Drysdale Customer Services Officer, also representing Dianne and Jeni her fellow staff members. They are at the Hancock Street Office to assist the Community in all matters connected with The City and its' services. They also accept requests for maintenance of public areas, which are the Councils responsibility. Vic Roads services and information are available at the Centre.

Cr. Tom O'Connor - City Update - Ward Issues and Concerns.
