From Lisa Neville's desk



BELLARINE ROADS

The Bellarine will benefit from nearly \$995,000 in projects to improve the safety and efficiency of the local road network as we are taking action to improve roads and road safety. A range of projects will be delivered to make our roads safer, help tackle congestion and aid regional development in communities like Drysdale, Moolap and Leopold.

Projects include:

- \$300,000 for improvements to bus bays on the Geelong-Portarlington Road, Leopold
- \$195,000 for pedestrian signals on Geelong-Portarlington Road at Drysdale
- \$90,000 for road safety improvements on Geelong-Portarlington Road at Moolap Station Road, Moolap
- \$410,000 for the installation of pedestrian operated traffic signals on the Geelong-Portarlington Road at the Bellarine Rail Trail crossing in Curlewis. This will include flashing warning lights placed 200-300 metres prior to the lights.

These projects are the result of consultation with the community and the City of Greater Geelong about local needs to improve their transport networks. I will continue to work to ensure that vital projects in the Bellarine area benefit from the State Government's road funding programs.

MEALS ON WHEELS

Another announcement I was happy to make concerns the very special people who volunteer to deliver Meals on Wheels. They will share in an extra \$600,000 in annual funding from the State Government to cover out-of-pocket expenses. The volunteers who help deliver healthy meals to vulnerable Victorians are the heart and soul of Meals on Wheels and deserve recognition. They are vital to the delivery of 4.2 million meals a year to 34,000

senior Victorians and younger people with a disability. We know that expenses are rising for volunteers and this extra recurrent funding of \$600,000 will help cover the costs of providing this vital service.

It is important to remember that Australia's five million helpers give a fifth of their time to community welfare such as Meals on Wheels. Volunteers contribute 700 million hours to the community and their numbers are growing. Older people tend to spend more time doing voluntary work than their younger counterparts, and a challenge for Meals on Wheels, like all other volunteer organisations, is to attract volunteers so I urge any Victorians who want to make a difference in their communities to become involved in this program which allows many older people to remain in their homes.

VICTORIAN VOLUNTEER SMALL GRANTS PROGRAM

Updated guidelines for the Victorian Volunteer Small Grants have been recently introduced, and funding has been extended to 2011. Since 2004, more than 1000 community groups have received over \$3 million to help them recruit and support volunteers. Grants of up to \$5,000 are available to assist organisations attract new volunteers from diverse backgrounds, create new volunteering opportunities and strengthen existing volunteer programs. 





Filipino Style

SPRING ROLLS (Filipino)


500gm minced pork/chicken
Spring onions sliced
1-2 cloves of garlic macerated
4 tablespoon knorr
OR maggi seasoning
1 medium onion sliced
fish sauce sprinkled to taste
2 sticks of celery thin sliced
1 packet spring roll wrapper thawed
2 carrots julienne sliced
canola or veg. oil for frying
¼ cabbage thinly sliced
4 tbsp sesame oil or peanut oil
Ground pepper sprinkle
sweet chilli sauce

Season pork or chicken with 1 tbsp of sesame oil. Heat remaining oil into a wok on high, then stir fry meat until it changes colour, remove and set aside. Put remaining oil into wok and sauté garlic, onion, until light brown, add vegetable ingredients, cover and cook 40 seconds stirring at intervals.

Stir in mince browned meat, add all seasonings add extra according to taste, remove, place into dish and cool.

Separate wrappers gently, and place filling in diagonal angle on a board. Put 2-3 tbsp. in one corner fold ends and roll into sausage shape, moisten the ends with water and stick down firmly. Repeat with each wrapper until all used.

On medium, heat canola oil in a flat fry pan, put in spring roll and cook until just golden brown and then turn over. They should be crunchy, remove and drain on paper towel. Serve hot on a plate with or without sauce. Enjoy!





1 packet rice noodles
(soaked to soften)
½ cup canola/veg oil
3 cloves garlic macerated
2 tbsp fish sauce
1 medium onion
4 tbsp soy sauce
2 chicken breasts or 4 thighs sliced in thin strips
1 tsp ground black pepper
½ cabbage shredded/chopped spring onions
2 medium carrots cut into strips lemon slices

1 chicken stock cube

OR chicken stock

3 sticks celery chopped thinly
In a big wok or saucepan heat oil and sauté garlic and onion until colour changes, stir in meat until brown, then add vegetables, simmer for 2 minutes. Add chicken stock and all seasoning on medium heat, stir vegetables, push to one side, stir in noodles then cover with vegetables and mix stirring at intervals until noodles are cooked and dry. You may need 2 ladles to stir and mix. Serve and garnish with spring onion and lemon

Note: You can substitute chicken with lean pork thin slices or a combination of both if you wish.







Strength training for older adults

Bellarine Community Health provides programs designed to promote better health and physical wellness for older adults. These programs include weight resistance strength training, chair-based strengthening programs and water based exercise classes. Based at different sites across the Bellarine Peninsula, the Physical Wellness Program (PWP) develops participants' strength, balance and mobility in a safe and social environment.



Normal ageing is characterised by a loss in muscle strength and mobility. This may lead to increased dependency, and reduced quality of life in older people. Ageing is associated with a loss of bone mineral density, often leading to osteoporosis and an increased risk of falls and fractures. Osteoporotic fractures afflict 60% of women and 30% of men over the age of 60 years in Australia. As people age there is also a tendency to slow down and become more inactive, further contributing to these changes.

Evidence shows that older adults benefit from increased muscular strength and endurance. Regular weight training increases and maintains muscle mass and bone density. This plays an important role in the prevention and treatment of osteoporosis. Strengthening the muscles that are important for balance and physical function will reduce the risk of falls and the likelihood of fractures. Strengthening muscles improves the ability to perform day-to-day general activities, allowing older adults to maintain their independence for longer.

The weight resistance strength training (WRT) program provides a safe and nonthreatening environment for older adults

to exercise under the supervision and guidance of a trained instructor. Instructors prepare individual exercise programs which include strength training, weight bearing activities, balance training, and flexibility exercises. The program also encourages regular physical activity through home based programs and progression to other suitable community based programs. The WRT program assists older adults to develop the skills and confidence they need to maintain and improve their physical health.

Participants require GP approval and an individual assessment prior to commencing. Due to the popularity of this program, a waiting period may apply.







from the garden gate


Can you remember when family homes had backyards, chooks and a water tank? Mum grew flowers in the front garden, whilst Dad grew vegetables out the back. Sound familiar. Suddenly this scenario has become the thing to do. Organic gardening is back. Thank goodness, even though many of us have been doing it for decades. The taste of home grown fruit and vegetables is a sensation that you will never forget. When was the last time you picked an apple or peach from the tree, bit into the flesh with juices running down your chin? I did, last summer. I have heard it said "Fresh is best", but organic fresh is better.

In my own garden I don't have the standard veggie patch, but grow flowers and vegetables together. Some call it a potager garden or a companion garden. Some have been known to call it a horticultural mess. But guess what, it works, and works well. Wigwams of beans and peas, tomatoes with roses, zucchini and daisies, apples with lavender and valerian, and lettuces with calendulas and fuchsias, all growing quite happily together. It will never make the glossy magazines but to me it is Paradise.

With the weather warming, mulch lightly so that the Spring rains can dampen our soil, then lay much thicker when the soil warms. Keep planting out the summer vegetables such as tomatoes, carrots, beetroot, zucchini, kale, sweet corn, cucumbers and potatoes. Give some radish and bean seeds to the children to plant and let them be their special plants. It is never too early to get into gardening. Continue sowing seeds of calendulas, cosmos as this help bring the bees.

Grab a cuppa or glass of wine and your secateurs and walk around the garden deadheading as you go. This is not only relaxing for you but good for the plants as well.

Jocelyn Mannix also shared with everyone that she believed the document was hand written by her late husband; this was a very sentimental moment and makes the document a reminder of his work also.


