HELP us save our Church Hall


This is the plea from parishioners of St James' Anglican Church in Collins Street, Drysdale. Their heritage listed Church Hall is showing its age and is in need of much t.l.c. They would love to extend and modernise it to make it a much more flexible building and a great place for community use. Investigations have tracked down the original plans in the Victorian State archives. These show that the builder was a Mr Lane and that the architects, JVT Ward & AEH Carleton, who formed their partnership in 1897, also designed other halls similar to St James' in and around Melbourne. However, St James' Church Hall is the only one of these still being used for its original purpose, and so the porch, front hall and stage must be retained and restored. The photograph shows the

porch of St James' Hall with the only remaining gothic style window. Building anything costs money, but renovating a Church Hall built in 1906 will cost megabucks.

However, the parishioners are not deterred, and fundraising continues, so watch out for notices about planned events. Subject to all the necessary permits and planning processes, something may be about to happen. If you would like to make a donation to the building fund, cheques can be made payable to 'St James' Restoration Fund' and sent to The Parish Treasurer, St James' Vicarage, PO Box 365, Drysdale, Vic 3222.

Times are hard at the moment and you might instead consider making a bequest to St James' Restoration Fund in your will. Then, at some time in the future, your generosity will help to pay off the outstanding loan, which will inevitably arise because of the cost of the renovations to the Hall. If you can help in any way, thank you so much for your support – it will mean a great deal to our community!





Domain Name

There are three main things to consider when registering a domain name.

The choice of Domain Name Registrar (an accredited company authorized to register Internet Domain Names), the Name Server - a computer connected to the internet which hosts your domain name's records, kind of like adding your details to the 'internet phone book' which will most likely be at the same company, and the Host of your Internet Services (the company through which your website and email are accessed) which may not necessarily

be the same company as mentioned above.

You can register your domain name just about anywhere, although there may be some restriction to registering an Australian Domain (.AU) overseas.

There are 26 accredited Domain Name Registrars (according to auDA) these organizations manage the registration of all Australian domains - ccTLDs domains that end in .AU.

In fact most companies that register domain names on the internet like your ISP - Internet Service Provider - for example, say iiNet or BigPond, are really just reseller for one or more of the accredited registrars mentioned above.

There is nothing to stop you from registering a domain name, before you have a website or need to use the domain name for email. You can go directly to one of the accredited registrar's website and order it online - assuming you have a credit card.

There is one catch however, a bit of a 'chicken or egg' dilemma; you will need an email address to confirm (and manage) your domain name's

registration. Actually it is possible to do everything by Fax, but this involves a lot or proof of identity documentation - which can take a while to process. And you still need to manage your domain name with an email address once you've finally got one, which means more Faxes and proof of ID documents to make these changes. You might not have a credit card anyway.

It is easier to have a third party, who have a credit card and an existing email address (like a.person@springdale.org.au),

> to register (and manage) the domain name for you - on your behalf - with one of the various registrars.

When you decided to use the domain name you have registered, for email or a website, you will need to alter the IP address details, in the records of

the Registrar's Name Server computer, to those supplied by the company who will be hosting your internet service.



An IP address is a set of four numbers separated by dots, which is used to locate a specific computer over a network, including the Internet. So the IP address of www.springdale.org.au is 203.0.178.91

So when SpringdDale launched their website, someone will have set the corresponding 'A' record - used for websites - of their Domain Name to the IP address above, so that anybody could then access the SpringdDale website by typing 'www.springdale.org.au' in the address bar of their browser.







from the garden

Bokashi Update - Anne Brackley

I am so pleased I invested a number of hours in the garden during October, because I have had very few hours to invest since then. The occasional weed gets pulled but there's been little time for anything else. I have picked a number of zucchinis, a couple of lettuces and the tomatoes are ripening well.

As I write this the egg plants and capsicums are in flower and I have many pumpkins on the vine. The difference in the two garden beds is quite dramatic with most plants being twice the size in the Bokashi plot as in the non Bokashi plot. Many people decided to give Bokashi

buckets as Christmas presents and so the number of people using the Bokashi system

continues to grow. We have Bokashi buckets (\$80) and the Bokashi grains (1kg \$7.50 and 3kg \$15) for sale at SpringDale. We also have Shift, special Bokashi grains that help dog droppings to break down more quickly.

- Clean concrete on your driveways and paths with undiluted distilled Vinegar over the area and do it again until the stain disappears.
- To catch the bugs while having an outdoor BBQ, place a bowl of Apple Cider Vinegar near some of the food but not near people and you will see that the bugs really do like the bowl of 'good juice' for them.
- Pour undiluted Vinegar around the kids sand-pit to keep cats from visiting and leaving their deposits. Re-apply a few months later as required.
- To avoid rough skin after your day in the garden, rinse your hands in distilled Vinegar before washing them.



The 'Rock' can tell you many tales of the regions history ... from bushrangers to the horse race meetings to being a movie set for the now famous Peter Weir film 'Picnic at Hanging Rock', it is all happening at this significant site in Victoria.

Hanging Rock is an extinct volcano and formed about 6 million years ago. It is 150 metres on the surrounding plain. There is a high content of soda in the solid lava and along with the rainwater falling over it, it has created the different rock formations known to geologists as 'soda trachyte'.

A wonderful area for families gathering to enjoy a day having a picnic or if you are racing minded there are race meetings. Walking paths and trails weave in and around the base of the Rock, and the main walk is wide and sealed which is made easier for all levels of fitness.

There is fishing in the dam which is stocked regularly along with the highlight of climbing to the pinnacle for the most magnificent view of the Macedon Ranges.

The wildlife consists of kangaroos, wallabys, koalas, and an echidna often making a special appearance.

The cafe serves modern cuisine and gift shop for the ever popular souvenirs.

During the warmer months the ranger will conduct a night tour, pointing out the nocturnal animals. It's lots of fun. Bookings are essential.

The site receives no Government funding so all monies from entry are used on the maintenance of the Rock and surrounding developments and areas. Separate entry fees apply for special occasions.

Plastic Bag & Waste, Clean Up Australia Day - www.cleanup.org.au

In 2006, 33.7% of all items collected on Clean Up Australia Day were plastic and 7.4% of all plastic items were supermarket retail shopping bags. An average of half a million shopping bags are collected every year on Clean Up Australia day.

Plastic shopping bags appeared in the Top Ten Rubbish Items in the 2006 Clean Up Australia Day Rubbish Report.

What can I recycle?

There are 2 types of plastic bags:

- 1. High Density Polyethylene (HDPE) bags They are the thin singlet bags used by over 80% of retailers, including supermarkets. These can be recycled at most supermarkets. Generally they are not collected through your local kerbside recycling, however one or two local councils are currently trialling their collection contact your local council first to see if they collect plastic bags.
- 2. Low Density Polyethylene (LDPE) bags These are the thicker bags used by less than 20% of retailers, usually for luxury goods. While they can be recycled there are few collection points. Check

with your local council to see if they collect LDPE plastics.


How does plastic litter harm the environment?

Many thousands of marine mammals and seabirds die every year around the world as a result of plastic litter. When the animal dies and decays the plastic is free again to repeat the deadly cycle. There are 2 major reasons that plastic bags are particularly problematic in the litter stream:

- 1. They last from 20 1000 years.
- 2. They escape and float easily in air and water, travelling long distances.
