Fire Victim **Fundraiser**

In the early hours of Sunday 16 August, a devastating fire took the lives of 24 year old Ashlee Holloway and four young children Brodie, Thomas, Cooper and McKenzie Holloway. Ashlee's husband Aaron was injured in the fire which destroyed their Clifton Springs home.

As Aaron tries to recover from the tragedy that took his young family, the local Clifton Springs Golf Club has arranged a fundraising day with the support of Aaron's family and the Drysdale Family Support Group. Whilst nothing can replace the loss of his family, it is possible to help Aaron replace some of the belongings. The fundraiser aims to raise in excess of \$10,000 through a golf day to be held on Sunday 1 November 2009.

The event will take place at Clifton Springs Golf Club with a modified Stableford competition for teams of 4 with a shotgun start at 12.30. Entry will cost \$70 per player. The entry fee includes a 3 course meal with beer and wine. Entry will be limited to 108 players.

During the meal there will be an auction and raffles with all items donated. Auction items include golf at Metropolitan Golf Club, golf at Commonwealth Golf Club, a cycling jersey signed by Cadel Evans and Robby McEwen a full set of Grand Final DVD's from 1965 to 1968 and many more. Raffle prizes include dinner on the Colonial Tramcar with overnight accommodation in Melbourne.

The Club has made it clear that every cent raised on the day will be donated for the benefit of Aaron. Entry forms are available from the Golf Club. 

Portarlington Band Rotunda Restoration

As the Member for Bellarine, I was pleased to announce Portarlington's historic band rotunda in Newcombe Street will be restored with the help of a \$30,000 State Government grant. We are supporting the rotunda's restoration because it will create a unique and central township identity and benefit the region through increased visitation and provide flow-on economic benefits.

Over the past 30 years, the rotunda has suffered a gradual decline, including a rotting sub-structure which has caused the foundations to sink. Works to structurally rectify and restore the rotunda have been funded by the Small Towns Development Fund. The restoration works are timely because the rotunda was built in 1910 and will celebrate its centenary next year.

In addition to State Government funding, Geelong City Council will contribute \$30,000 towards the \$64,480 restoration project, with the remainder to be in kind.

Geelong and Bellarine buses boosted

Geelong and Bellarine residents will benefit from an additional 400 weekly bus services as part of the State Government's \$80 million package to boost local public transport links. From Monday 7 September, residents have benefit from more frequent services and longer operating hours. This includes an additional 39 weekend services to give residents greater choice of when to travel and the option of leaving the car at home. The improvements form Stage 1 of the State Government's \$80 million improvement package for bus services in Greater Geelong and Bellarine Peninsula as part of the \$38 billion Victorian Transport Plan. Improvements include improved journey times and better frequency of bus services and seven new low-floor buses will be introduced and operate across all routes increasing access for all passengers.

The second stage of improvements will be introduced next year including a new central bus interchange in Moorabool Street and better bus connections for residents in areas including Ocean Grove, Barwon Heads, St Leonards and Queenscliff. When I started working with Kel to produce this column we promised a virtual tour of many of our streets during the 1940s.

I was so impressed to hear about so many different businesses and industries that were operated in the 1940s that don't exist now.

Let's start near SpringDale in Princess Street. On the corner of Murradoc Road and Princess Street there was the National Australia Bank, which was where Kel's family lived in the residence. Next door was and still is the Drysdale Fire Brigade, where Kel is a Life Member. Then was a house, where Jim Bennett, who owned a single seater 1935 Ford car with a canvas top, lived.

Then the Drysdale Primary School Principal's residence where Mr Wilson lived (this is where my grandfather and family lived when he was the Principal).

Then the RSL, which had been a German church in earlier days, followed by Bush Nursing Centre which treated everything



from fractured heads to splinters. This became the first home of SpringDale Community Cottage in the 1980s. Then there was the coffin maker, Mr Butler. Further down the hill there was a clay quarry for house bricks to be made and used in the area. The Bartletts lived next door to the railway line and had to open and shut the railway gates 3 times a day for the 3 trains. Most of the goods transported were to Swan Island and to Fort Queenscliff during the war. The back loads consisted of shell grit, pipe clay and hay.

There was the very small home that is still just standing where the McKiernan's brought up 12 children.


The whole house seems to be the

size of a kitchen and family room these days. Five of their boys went to the second World War and all 5 came back.

Then there were sheep, cattle and flower farms. A WAF camp was almost built but then the war finished. Cross the road and come back towards the centre of town. there was a big cheese factory established in 1923 by the Drysdale Dairying Company and the manager was Mr Onley.

Next time we'll work back up Princess Street and talk about the buildings on the west side of the street.

around the garden

From little things, big things grow







We are now well and truly into Spring. Last months rainfall has made a huge difference to our gardens. Plants and bulbs are jostling for space, roses hold a ruby glow with their new growth and the vegetables have had an amazing growth spurt. Let's hope that the good rainfall continues to fall upon our gardens and continues to fill our tanks and dams.

From little things, big things grow. In a garden, life springs from seeds or cuttings. We pop them into the ground, nurture them and then they reward our efforts by flowering or fruiting. Friendships can also grow from gardens as gardeners are a very giving lot. They love to share cuttings and seeds from their gardens, and this in turn spreads the love of gardening.

Herbs are a great addition to any garden. Spread them amongst the flower garden and vegetable plot to deter pests. Garlic, chives and onions are a good companion for roses. Basil and tomatoes just love each other. Apple trees love lavender, wallflowers and nasturtiums.

By combining the flower and vegetable gardens together, creates chaos for most pests. This confusion however, does not apply to the good guys like bees, praying mantis and ladybirds.

In the vegetable garden keep sowing beans for successive crops. You can now plant out tomatoes, I prefer the heirloom varieties such as Tommy Toe, Black Krim,

Amish Paste (this makes fantastic tomato puree and sauces), and an unusual yellow one that has a fuzzy skin, Wapsipinicon Peach. This is one that I grew last year, it looks different but has such a super sweet flavour. All heirloom varieties are vigorous growers so they will require a strong framework. They are hardy and seem more adaptable to our harsh summers. Tomatoes need calcium, so if your soil is acidic (pH below 6.5) add a couple of handfuls of dolomite to the soil.

When planting annuals or vegetables, remember to be water-wise. Apply manures, mulch and if space allows place together those plants that require different watering levels together. Now is the perfect time to get out and enjoy the sunshine and all that a garden has to give.

r school Tutoring

There are a number of students on the Bellarine Peninsula who would benefit from one to one or small group assistance with maths and/or English over and above what they are receiving in the classroom.

As a classroom teacher I know that because of the demands of the whole class, it is very difficult to devote the extra time that struggling students need with their maths and/or English skills. Offering

ongoing catch-up classes at lunchtime is not a viable long term option as students need a break during the day.

This term a number of teachers from Bellarine Secondary College have been working with the SpringDale Neighbourhood Centre, to provide after school help in maths for struggling students.

For \$2 a week (which helps pay for afternoon tea and costs) a small group of Year 7 and 8 students at Bellarine are getting the one to one attention that they need. The once a week tutoring involves developing the students' basic maths skills as well as working with them on topics currently being taught in class.

Teachers at Bellarine are already seeing positive results from the tutoring program as students are gaining confidence and doing much better in the classroom. One

student, who had been struggling, was happily telling his mates how he explained fractions to his mum.

Parents are welcome to get involved.

Plans are underway to expand the program across the Bellarine to include English/literacy and maths tutoring to children in Years 5-8. Local primary schools are being asked to come on board.

We would like to be able to offer assistance to many more students, but we need more volunteer tutors.

While the program is run by qualified teachers, we have a number of community volunteers who are doing a fantastic job with the kids. If you have a maths background or can assist with English skills and can afford to help out for an hour a week, please get in touch. The only requirements are an interest in helping kids achieve their potential, a current (free) police check, and a good understanding of basic maths or English skills.


the planners give plenty of notice so that the community can be in attendance.

Beetroot - a food for all seasons

Growing beetroot

"Beetroot is very easy to grow and seeds or seedlings can be planted all year round. They like a sunny position and a fertile, free draining soil. Plant 150mm (6") apart, and protect from frost and birds." - Don Burke

When buying beetroot, remember that the smaller the beetroot the sweeter the taste. When you wash them be careful not to break the skin as this would permit valuable vitamins to escape during the cooking period.

To minimise bleeding during cooking do not peel the beetroot and leave a portion (2- 3 cm) of the stem in place. Wash well and do not cut off the tapering root. To boil beetroot, place them into cold water and cook them for 1 hour for small ones and up to 2 hours for larger ones. Then dip them in cold water and gently rub the skins off them. Some people consider that baking beetroot, as one would potatoes, is superior to boiling them. They should be wrapped in foil and baked in a moderate oven. Test with a toothpick before removing them. When cool enough to handle, the skin will come off easily.

Beetroot with Orange Sauce



- 4 Beetroot cooked and shaped with a melon baller
- 1 tbsp brown sugar
- 1 tbsp cornflour
- 1 tbsp butter
- 2 tbsps tarragon vinegar
- 1 cup orange juice

Combine sugar, vinegar, orange juice and butter in a saucepan and place over medium heat. Blend cornflour with enough water to mix, stir in orange juice mixture and bring to the boil.

Add warmed beets and heat through to serve.

spring Bake

Try this tasty recipe from the SpringDale Men's Kitchen. It is full of succulent fresh vegetables and really is a meal in one... try it tonight!

2 medium Sebago potatoes
1 chopped red onion
100gm baby spinach
200gm baby tomatoes, halved
1 chopped red capsicum
2 tablespoons olive oil
40gm chopped pancetta
40gm chopped bacon
8 eggs
½ cup thickened cream

½ cup shredded parmesan cheese

1/4 cup grated tasty cheese

Preheat oven 200°C. Grease a 5cm deep, 26cm x 16.5cm ovenproof dish. Pierce potatoes and place in microwave

on high for 4 minutes. Allow to cool, then slice thinly. Heat oil in frying pan, add onion and cook for 3 minutes. Add bacon and pancetta, cook and stir for 3 minutes. Add spinach and cook for 1 minute. In a separate bowl place onion mixture, tomatoes, capsicum and combine. Arrange half the potato slices over prepared dish and top with half the onion mixture. Then another layer of potato followed by onion mixture. Whisk eggs and cream in a bowl and pour over vegetable mixture. Sprinkle with tasty and parmesan cheese. Bake for 30 to 35 minutes until mixture is set and golden.

Serves 4

Warm Beetroot Salad

1kg Beetroots French dressing

1 tbsp Caraway seeds

1 large onion

2 tbsp butter

Top and tail beetroot and bake in a moderate oven just as you would bake potatoes. Prick them with a toothpick to test when they are cooked. Cool a little and peel. Slice thinly into a bowl. Toss with french dressing and sprinkle with caraway seeds. Fry onion until golden and pour over beetroot with the butter it has been cooked in.

Delicious with cold meats. *Serves 6-8*

Beetroot Dip

This is so easy and delightfully tasty

425g can beetroot slices, drained 1 tsp ground cumin

1 tbsp finely chopped fresh dill sprigs 1/3 cup plain yoghurt




