Following on from last month's feature to celebrate the upcoming 100 year anniversary of the SpringDale Hall, where and how it all began is of special interest. Its roots were down in Wyndham Street near the McClouds Waterholes, a small building called the Tuckfield Chapel was erected circa 1849. Reverend Tuckfield held services there hence the name. Some years later around 1855 a new Chapel was erected and the original extended

to house the minister.

A plaque was unveiled in 1999 by a descendant of Francis Tuckfield on the site of the original building which stood near the junction of Jetty Road and Wyndham Street. By 1862 it became obvious that the township of Drysdale was going to prosper and grow along the main road that we know today. With that in mind the Chapel was shifted to the site where the SpringDale Hall now stands.

#### **Bellarine Buses**

As a result of contact from constituents regarding public transport services on the Bellarine, I recently questioned the Minister for Public Transport in Parliament. The government had committed to a bus review for the Bellarine and this would have been an ideal time to allow community input into improving services.

Unfortunately, the Minister has now said there is no review of the Bellarine Peninsula public bus network planned for 2012-13 by either the Department of Transport or Public Transport Victoria. This is not acceptable. While the current bus service providers do an excellent job, the growing population on the Bellarine demands that the public

transport network is targeted to adequately service residents' needs. Without a review of the current bus services, taking into account the growth corridors on the peninsula, it is not possible to provide service that meets demand.

#### **Retirement Villages Information**

The guides titled Good practice to address key issues and Internal dispute resolution guidelines for retirement village owners and managers are designed to prevent disputes and promote good relations and communications between managers and residents.

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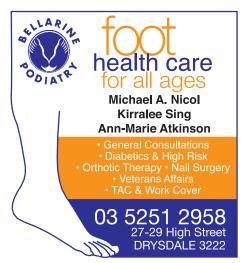

#### **Drysdale & Clifton Springs Community Association Inc.** A new summit

DCSCA members attended the four-day Town Summit at SpringDale from Friday 16 to Monday 19 November. The Summit rounded off the Local Economic Development project, which SpringDale and DCSCA worked on for eighteen months.

The Summit presented locally created plans for our towns' economic, physical, social and cultural development. It showed that local people have clear views about their area and that their views don't always coincide with those of the developers and planners who are determining our towns' future.

Summit visitors were encouraged to have their say about the Local Economic Development project to increase the number and diversity of local jobs; about the Streetscape to Artscape project to create community oriented art exhibits in our open spaces (another SpringDale-DCSCA collaboration); and about the new cycling trails featuring on local street maps (a DCSCA initiative). Visitors were invited to comment on the council's Urban Design Framework for Drysdale's development; and to join the campaign for a Drysdale bypass, which will improve the local quality of life and ease of travel.

#### and a new beginning

The Town Summit showcased the ingenuity and creativity of local projects and plans and the next stage is to gain support for them. The new DCSCA Committee is eager to work with anyone who came to the Summit, liked the look of a particular local project or plan and wants to see it happen.

We'll seek support from our two new local councillors - Rod Macdonald (Cheetham Ward) and Lindsay Ellis (Coryule Ward) and from Geelong's first directly elected mayor, Keith Fagg, who responded positively to DCSCA's proposals to improve the council's consultation practices. With a state election due in November 2014, we'll ask state MP Lisa Neville to press for state government support.

Just a reminder that the focus of the 2013 Festival of Glass is a glass 'Expo' at the Bellarine Secondary College Sports Centre in Peninsula Drive on Sunday 17 February from 10am to 4pm. Ensalada de Navidad Recipe. This is a classic holiday recipe from Mexico City. It is a sweet and nutty treat that goes great with any savoury dish.



#### Ingredients

2 small cooked beets, peeled and diced

1 large cooked carrot diced

1 orange, peeled and chopped

1 apple, peeled and diced

1/4 fresh pineapple, peeled, cored and diced

1 large banana, diced

½ cup unsalted nuts, almonds or peanuts Seeds of ½ small pomegranate

1 tbsp lime or lemon juice

3 tbsp salad oil

½ teaspoon sugar

dash of salt

Mix all the fruits. Put lime or lemon juice, salad oil, sugar and salt into a screw top jar. Shake until blended and sugar has dissolved. Pour the dressing over the fruit salad and toss well. Pile the salad into a salad bowl and garnish with the nuts and pomegranate seeds. Let it stand in the refrigerator until chilled. 10 servings

#### Snowflake Cookies

#### Ingredients

1 cup butter, softened

1 cup sugar

2 large eggs

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

1 teaspoon almond extract

31/4 cups all-purpose flour

2 teaspoons baking powder

½ teaspoon salt

Edible paint icing

#### Garnish

Silver dragees, sugar pearls, sparkling sugar

#### Method

In a large bowl, beat butter and sugar at medium speed with an electric mixer until fluffy. Beat in eggs, vanilla and almond extract until combined. In a medium bowl, combine flour, baking powder and salt.

Gradually add to sugar mixture, beating until smooth. Wrap dough in heavy-duty plastic wrap, and refrigerate 1 hour. Preheat oven to 180°C. Line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper.

On a lightly floured surface, roll out dough to 5mm thickness. Cut with assorted snowflake cookie cutters and place 5cm apart on prepared baking sheets. Chill dough 15 minutes. Bake for 10 minutes, or until edges are very lightly browned. Let cool for 2 minutes on baking sheet. Remove from pans and cool completely on wire racks.

Paint cookies with Edible Paint Icing. Garnish with silver dragees, sugar pearls and sparkling sugar, if desired.

#### **Edible Paint Icing**

1/4 cup cold water 3 tablespoons meringue powder 2 cups pure icing sugar Food coloring, optional

In a medium bowl, combine water and meringue powder; whisk until foamy.





Whisk in icing sugar until smooth. Add food coloring, if desired. Use immediately.

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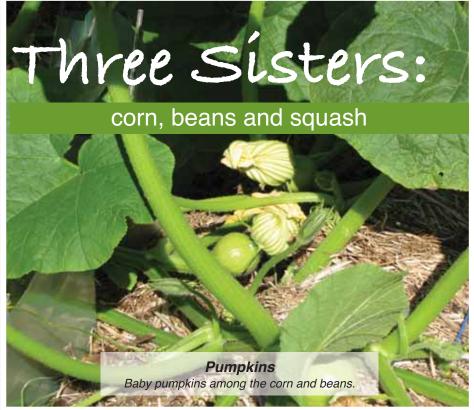
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The Three Sisters are a good example of companion planting. The sisters in this 'family' are sweetcorn, climbing beans and cucurbits (squash, cucumber, pumpkin, etc.).

The sisters get along so well because each benefits from the others. The sweetcorn provides a structure for the beans to climb - no stakes or trellis required. The beans put nitrogen back into the soil for the hungry sweetcorn and squash. As they climb they tie the sweetcorn stalks together and reduce wind damage. The squash spreads along the ground, depriving weed seeds of sunlight. Its leaves also act as a living mulch, keeping moisture in the soil, and its prickly hairs deter pests.

#### Location

Because sweetcorn or maize is windpollinated, you will need to plant it in a block at least a metre across. If you plant in rows, you will get poor pollination and few kernels in your corn cobs. You want a bed at least 1 metre square for sweetcorn and more like 2 x 2 metres for the Three Sisters. Choose a sunny spot.

#### **Bed preparation**

Sweetcorn and squash both need a rich soil with lots of organic matter, so work in plenty of compost and/or well-rotted manure a couple of weeks before you start sowing.

#### Sowing

All these plants need warm soil to germinate, and the best time to sow your sweetcorn is from early December onwards. If you have enough space, you could plant a block of sweetcorn every four weeks from December to February to ensure a continuous supply.

You want one sweetcorn every 20 cm, so that makes a block of 16 plants per square metre.

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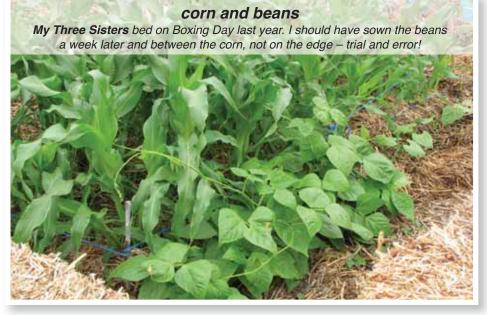

The Three Sisters:



Poke the kernels about 2 cm into the soil and water in. Mulch lightly to prevent the soil from drying out. Keep your corn well watered after the seedlings emerge.

#### **Timing**

Timing is important with the *Three Sisters*. You should sow your climbing beans 4 weeks after the sweetcorn. Any earlier and the beans will smother the corn: much later and the beans will be too shaded to get established. Poke the beans into the soil between the corn seedlings, which should be sturdy little

plants about 20 cm high by now.

At this stage you can also plant your squash seedlings around the outside of the corn. Last year I used Anna Swartz pumpkin as the third sister. That worked OK, but it's such a big bruiser of a plant that it needs lots of space. You might want to try a smaller pumpkin, a summer squash or a cucumber.

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## RED Recycling program

A group of ten Grade 5 children have been working hard to make a difference. These students, called the Millennium Kids, attended an environmental leadership program called Doing More With Less. During this two-day workshop in Geelong, they selected an issue that they wanted to address back at school. With the school's recent focus on reducing waste, the students decided they wanted to move even further towards becoming a zero waste school. The school already had in place three systems of recycling our waste; Comingled recycling, Bokashi bins and paper and cardboard recycling. As part of the Rubbish Free Lunch Challenge in 2011, we had audited the waste that was being put in our rubbish bins and despite our push towards Nude Food, we found the vast majority of this was plastic. The students then decided to enroll in the RED Recycling program which redirects



plastics from entering landfill and reprocesses it into benches, tables, seats and signs that school can use in their grounds. After selecting the program, the Grade 5s then participated in an incursion where they learnt about the devastating effects plastic waste is having on our environment.

"It takes 660 years for a plastic bag to break down," said Patrick Skuza, one of the Millennium Kids. "We worked out that if we throw away a plastic bag now, it may be found by our great, great, great, great, great grandchildren."

The school is now collecting soft plastics and for the remainder of the year, for every kilogram of plastic we can collect, we will receive \$5 credit towards the purchase of recycled products such as outdoor seating, tables, signs and playground equipment that we can use here at school. Students from all year levels are not only collecting plastics here at school, but have also started to bring plastics in from home as well. If any members of our local community wish to recycle their soft plastics and help contribute to our plastic drive, you can drop off your plastic bags at the front

Hamish Terry summed up the reason why the school is so enthusiastic about reducing its waste, "if we keep living the way we are, there won't be much of the world left for our children."

The staff are good at Vision Australia, nothing is too much trouble for them and I always tell them how much I appreciate what they are doing for me. I think it's good to say something nice -I do that all the time where ever I go.

Kel would like to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year although he did phrase it a little differently to me but I'm sure this is what he meant.

I look forward to Kel's stories next year - he has decided that he might have a few more stories in him.

#### **Beware Door To Door Sales**

Crime Stoppers Australia in conjunction with Consumer Affairs is reminding Victorians to be careful of travelling con men who pose as tradespeople. This is an annual initiative aimed at generating awareness of the dangers of accepting door-to-door offers of cheap labour or services. Telltale signs include asking for cash up front and offering deals for 'today only'. To avoid falling victim to con men, always ask for identification and check that the trader is registered on the Aust Gvts www.business.gov.au website before making a decision. If in doubt report to the national Travelling Con Men hotline on 1300 133 408.

Partysafe provides information to help minimise problems, such as intoxicated guests or gatecrashers ruining your fun - register your party with the police, and if they are called to your event, they have all the information they need Complete the Partysafe registration form online or from your local police. Make sure you enter all the details correctly and submit the form to the local police station nearest the party. Collect a poster from your local police station to place at the front door showing guests the party has been registered with Victoria Police. When registering, consider the numbers likely to attend, if there will be alcohol and whether you have informed neighbours. Please register your party at least one week before. ## The Book Club

### Autumn Laing by Alex Miller

On Monday November 5, the Book Group met to discuss Autumn Laing by Alex Miller. Miller is quite a prolific writer producing a book about every two years and Autumn Laing is his 10th novel.

The story begins in 1991 when 85 year old Autumn Laing is still living at Old Farm on the banks of the Yarra River which had been home to a group of artists, writers, poets and their supporters from the 1930s onwards. With old age, she has become surly and reclusive. Always a strongminded character, she was, in her youth, full of grandiose ideas and scornful of traditional teaching and boring painting. When she met Patrick Donlan, it was her opportunity to influence him and discover an exciting new talent which would change the entire Australian art scene.

At 85, after believing that she has glimpsed Edith, Patrick's former wife, Autumn decides to write a memoir. Is her motive to claim her place in history as Patrick's muse? Is it to apologise to Edith? Is she seeking absolution for sins of which does not truly repent?

Readers familiar with the Melbourne art scene of around the middle of last century will immediately recognise the story of Sydney Nolan and Sunday Reed and her husband John.





The professional and personal lives of members of their clique were extremely entangled and this book reflects that. Autumn Laing is a work of fiction, not a biography, and it may be difficult for those familiar with the life of Sydney Nolan to make the distinction.

This is not just a book for art lovers although it provoked an interesting discussion of the changes occurring in the Australian art scene at the time. Readers in our group had mixed reactions, generally agreeing that Alex Miller is a good writer and his personal knowledge of the characters and times shines through. We gave this book average score of 8/10.

This month we will bring a biography of our own choice to discuss at our meeting and January will be a chance to show and tell a book that we have enjoyed - perhaps over the holidays.

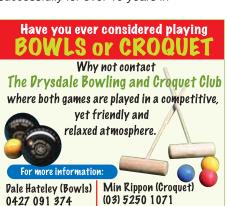
