#### Hi Friends and Friends I'm yet to meet.

Sometimes when we start a project at SpringDale we have an idea of a small outcome that might be achieved but if we then continue to deliver and listen to people, it's hard to know where this achievement might lead. An example of this is Kel's Corner regular article in The SpringDale Messenger. Kel has wanted to write a book for a long time. When I started capturing his stories I never dreamt that we would eventually have enough content to form it into a book. During this month our writing tutor Laurent Boulanger has helped to collate and publish Kel's book. This was the culmination of many people doing many tasks along the way and many people telling us how much they love Kel's Corner. Not only have we published Kel's Corner but also a children's book I wrote 16 years ago called Have you seen the Bunyip Lately. Both are available from SpringDale in the lead up to Christmas and to help fund the long awaited SpringDale's kitchen redevelopment. We had been trying to work out how to raise the extra money for the kitchen and our Men's Kitchen Groups may also write a cookbook. Over the years we have highlighted some of our men and their favourite recipes - watch out for this in the new year. As we continue to work out our point of difference with other community centres in the area, we might become a publishing powerhouse. Please look out for Laurent's very well respected courses in 2016 and perhaps you'll be able to complete your book which has been sitting on that shelf for so many years.

Art at SpringDale started with very small classes and we now have 3 very full classes each week and a self running art mentoring group every Wednesday afternoon. During January SpringDale will transform into an Art Gallery for almost the whole month. The Art Shows will allow local artists to show their ever increasing variety of subjects, styles and life enriching works of art.

Our groups continue to grow and meet needs while those needs exist. Over this month we have seen the commencement of the Diabetes Support Group, our Bellarine Kinship Carers group continues to meet the growing needs of families who take on caring roles and our Bellarine Fathers' Group is continuing to try to find people who might benefit from this. Our Men's Cooking Groups have been very successful for almost 10 years and perhaps this is a way for the father's group to begin as I'm sure every woman would love to have dinner made for herself and family. We are looking for a volunteer to help facilitate this group.

The courses offered and the groups we facilitate are always because of the needs and desires of our community, people who wish to learn or people who wish to share a skill. New ideas for next year are Mouth Organs for Beginners, Latin for Beginners and Getting the Best out of your Sewing Machine and Overlocker. These new options will complement our wide range of courses already offered.

Thank you for welcoming The SpringDale Messenger into your home. Thank you for taking the time to read our communication link with so many in our community. Thank you for supporting our advertisers who help to fund this free magazine for your enjoyment. Super thanks to Lyn Ingles who has been our graphic designer of The SpringDale Messenger for the last 8 years and has decided to retire from this role. We owe a great deal of thanks to Lyn for bringing The SpringDale Messenger from a black and white monthly newsletter to a full colour award winning magazine. During these 8 years the circulation of the Messenger has grown from 3500 copies per month to a regular 9000 copies and quarterly 15000 copies per issue. #### **Bellarine Relay For Life**

Once again I recently had the pleasure of attending the opening of the "Bellarine Relay for Life" held at the Collendina oval. 2015 was the 5th running of the event and as with other years it was a resounding success, thanks to the organisers, volunteers and of course participants. This year 35 teams entered, made up of hundreds of people all prepared to take part in the 24 hour event to raise important funds for cancer research and in doing so remember loved family members or friends lost to cancer or to support those currently fighting the disease. Fittingly, this year the first lap was walked by survivors and carers. I take this opportunity to congratulate the Chair of the Bellarine Relay for Life, Heather Grant, and her team for the magnificent work they put in each year to organise the event and also Loz Hardman the 2014 "Spirit of Relay" winner for her wonderful efforts. I again congratulate all the volunteers and those who took part.



I was disappointed that Council did not receive a grant for local CCTV funding under the "Public Safety Infrastructure Fund", which is a highly competitive grants program. I am still very much prepared to work with the likes of the Drysdale Neighbourhood Watch in having CCTV installed in the future. The Department of Justice and Regulation will provide the council feedback on its unsuccessful application.

## Additional Funding For Bellarine Schools

Schools across the Bellarine will share in more than \$950,000 of extra funding thanks to the 2015/16 State Budget. Drysdale Primary received \$52,898 and Clifton Springs \$85,210 on top of the funds already provided. Bellarine Secondary College received a much needed \$335,400. For the College it is on top of the \$1.1 million to be allocated for building refurbishment works.



The funding is all part of the State Governments plan to help kids learn, give parents more confidence and provide resources that teachers need.



We are extremely pleased to report that after recent discussions with Milemaker Petroleum, they have agreed to waive the \$5500.00 costs that were imposed against DCSCA by VCAT.

This is an immense relief to the Committee and the membership, as well as to the community in general and now enables DCSCA to concentrate on the issues that we are involved in. Association President, Rick Paradise said; "because that financial impost was hanging over our heads, we have been unable to fully function as well as would normally be the case, but now we can refocus and get back on track to deliver many of the projects we have been working on."

## A welcome outcome

There are so many people out there to thank who have supported us through the whole campaign. The committee has been more recently impressed by the generosity of members of the community who have been offering financial donations to build up a fund to pay those costs.

Those donations are now not needed and the DCSCA will be contacting all donors to have their donations returned. Some may say we initially over reacted when we called for support, but as the 7 December payment deadline was fast approaching, we felt we had to do something quickly.

There was the possibility if we could not have raised enough funds to pay these costs

before the stipulated date that DCSCA would find itself facing further legal fees, and the committee decided enough was enough.

The positive thing about this fund raising effort was that many people pledged financial support even before we asked for it.

Despite the rocky start in coming to Drysdale, Milemaker have told us they are committed to work with and support the many local clubs and associations in our area.

Due to the increased demand for our service our budget is being stretched and we are looking for donations to assist in the purchase of food and to prepare us for our Christmas Hampers.



#### The History Of Coriyule Homestead



When Bayview was asked by Clarke Hopkins Clarke, the architects for Woolworths and Bayview Central, for a theme for the shopping centre's graphics, Coriyule Homestead immediately came to mind.

Aside from its impressive architectural design and the fact that it is reportedly the oldest remaining structure on the Bellarine Peninsula, the Homestead has a rich, historical background which centres around the pioneer spirits of its two lady squatters, Anne Drysdale and Caroline Newcomb.

Even in today's era of modern transport and equipment, taking on an agricultural enterprise of over 10,000 acres is a formidable undertaking. However, Anne and

Caroline managed to do just this, as women working against the odds in the colony's first years.

After obtaining the Coriyule freehold in 1848, the two women commissioned Melbourne architect Charles Laing to design the Homestead in a unique gothic revival style which is just as impressive today as it was back then.

The Homestead, which remains in private hands, has undergone a recent restoration but the original architectural plans have been incorporated into the artwork of the shopping centre corridor, allowing them to be enjoyed daily by Bayview's residents and visitors.



Now that summer is here, it's time to get cucurbits into the ground. That's the pumpkin tribe, including summer squash, zucchini, cucumbers, rockmelons and watermelons.

You can either transplant seedlings or sow the large, flat seeds directly where you want them to grow. Because I like to grow heirloom varieties and not just take 'pot luck' (sorry, bad pun) with what the garden centre decides to stock, I grow mine from seed — but I sow the seeds in pots to give them the best start in life. I sow the seeds into biodegradable paper pots from mid-November to early December and keep them on a windowsill or a cold frame until they germinate. That way the seedlings get started in a protected environment, safe from hungry snails and slugs.

These plants are all strong growers, with rambling vines, thick foliage and large, juicy fruit, so they need plenty of tucker. I enrich the soil with a generous top-dressing of home-made compost a few days before planting. If you don't have home-made compost, then store-bought cow and sheep

manure, mushroom compost and soil enrichers such as Humus Plus are good alternatives.

Whatever you use, fork the soil lightly to break up any surface crust, then water well, spread the manure/compost, water well again, then put a thick layer of organic mulch (e.g. peastraw) over the top to prevent it from drying out. Then – you guessed it – water well!

To plant out your seedlings (or sow your seeds), push the mulch apart to make 'nests'

then dig a hole and pop your seedling in – or if growing from seed, just push a couple of seeds into the loose soil with your fingertip (cull the weaker of the two later).

Don't plant them too close together: the bigger pumpkins will soon ramble 3–5 metres in all directions. Zucchini are more compact, but still need at least a square metre per plant. Cucumbers, rockmelons, squash and the smaller varieties of pumpkin can be grown up a sturdy trellis, to save space and for better ventilation and ripening.

#### **Geoff Wisbey**

Geoff Wisbey was President of the Drysdale RSL Sub Branch for 15 years until he retired earlier this year.

Geoff Wisbey was called up for service on March 10th 1942 to the C.M.F. (Citizen Military Forces). He was sent to Bonegilla Infantry Training Camp and two weeks later was transferred to Werribee to the newly formed 112th Light Anti-Aircraft Regiment with Batteries 159-160-161.

After waiting three months for equipment, which included 36 Bofor guns, the Regiment was then positioned around the Victoria Coast, Yallourn, Melbourne, Queenscliff, Pt. Lonsdale and Pt. Nepean. Early in September 1942 the 159 Battery was relocated to the Dandenong railway Sale Yards and troops were granted 10 days final leave. On returning to the unit on September 15th Geoff raised his age to join the A.I.F. (Australian Imperial Force).

"After loading all the equipment on the train we departed for somewhere North via the East Coast, arriving in Brisbane. We detrained and in convoy drove to the Ascot Race Course. Four days later we left in convoy for somewhere North. Follow the truck in front of you, they said. Unfortunately my truck was forced to stop behind a tram at a tram stop and lost contact with the other four trucks in a convoy for quite some time. Eventually we caught up and all equipment was loaded onto the train. After a discussion with two girls from a Secondary School we were told that Mt. Isa was the end of the line and so Darwin was the most likely final destination.

These girls took our home addresses and kept in touch with our families throughout the war years".

"I next served with an Engineers Unit at Morotai in 1945 and as the war was close to ending on July 1st I volunteered for service with International Red Cross and saw service in the Phillipines, South of Manilla, caring for the prisoners of war returning from Japan. We served hot meals, hot mild coffee, doughnuts and two stubbies a day and of course, Cocoa Cola. I will always remember meeting and shaking hands with Lady Mountbatten, head of International Red

Returning to Australia in December 1945, I got married and sixteen days later was sent to Rabaul, guarding Japanese prisoners, driving and stripping Japanese tanks. After 3 months it was found that I had more than 30 months tropical service, so I was returned to Australia in April 1946 and was discharged on June 28th 1946" Geoff recounted.


Marketing is an essential ingredient of small business, in particular Direct Mail can be a great tool for you to keep in touch with your clients. Now with eMail as the new normal channel for business communication, it is even easier - and a lot cheaper.

You could use Microsoft Word, Excel and Outlook as a good starting point. The first thing you have to have is a client list (database). On the list will be the client's first name, last name, eMail - as a minimum, and phone number, business name, address as a bonus.

What makes it "Direct" mail is that you are going to address the piece to "Dear Sharon" or "Hi Bill" so you are talking directly to the client rather than a "To The Householder".

The difference between useful marketing and spam is what you say. If your message or offer is useful to the client then it may get read. Otherwise, if it is inappropriate or irrelevant then it is SPAM. Lastly, remember to have an opt out button to make your eMail legal, and to not annoy or alienate your clients.

#### **Apple Crisp**

6 Serves

#### For the crumb topping:

½ cup flour

½ cup oats

½ cup brown sugar

½ tspn baking powder

1/4 tspn ground cinnamon

dash of salt

 $\frac{1}{3}$  cup unsalted butter, diced into small chunks

#### For the Apple filling:

3-4 large Granny Smith apples, peeled and sliced thin

- 3 tbspn butter, melted
- 2 tbspn flour
- 1 tbspn lemon juice
- 3 tbspn milk

½ tspn vanilla extract

1/4 cup brown sugar


½ tspn ground cinnamon

dash of salt

#### Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C.
- In a medium size bowl combine the crumb topping ingredients with a fork or pastry blender until it resembles small crumbs. Refrigerate while you prepare the apple filling.
- 3. For the Apple Filling: In a small bowl, combine melted butter and flour until well blended. Add lemon juice, milk and vanilla and stir well. Stir in brown sugar, cinnamon, and salt. Pour butter mixture





over apples and toss to coat. Pour apple mixture into an 20cms x 20cms baking dish and spread into an even layer. Sprinkle crumb topping evenly over the apples. Bake for

30-35 minutes or until golden brown and top is set. Remove from oven and allow to cool for at least 10 minutes before serving.

4. Serve with Vanilla Ice Cream and Homemade Caramel Sauce (See recipe)

#### Notes:

To make this recipe ahead of time: Make the apple filling, adding a tiny bit more lemon juice so the apples don't brown. Store the apple filling in an air-tight container, in the fridge, for up to one day. Make the crumble topping and put it in a separate ziplock bag, in the fridge. When ready to bake, remove from the fridge, and sprinkle the topping on top. Bake as directed.

Makes about 2½ cups

#### **Ingredients**

34 cup butter

1½ cups brown sugar, firmly packed

- 2 tbspn water
- ¼ tspn salt
- 1 tbspn vanilla extract
- ½ ¾ cup evaporated milk

#### Method

- Add butter, brown sugar, water, and salt to medium saucepan over medium heat. Stir continuously until the better melts.
- 2. Once the better has melted bring the mixture to a boil. Boil for about 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove from heat and stir in vanilla and ½ cup evaporated milk. Stir until smooth. Add more evaporated milk if you'd like a thinner consistency.
- To store, pour mixture into a mason jar and refrigerate for up to a week. Re-warm it in the microwave for a few seconds before serving.



## Why people move to our fantastic part of the world

John Brennan moved to Drysdale 11 years ago, with his wife Margaret, has brought a great deal of history from the Northern Wimmera and Southern Mallee with him. John and many others from up that way would often holiday in Portarlington. From 1959 John, Margaret and ever growing family would come with caravan in tow for a few weeks, if there'd been a harvest. The first time John came into SpringDale it was to get some photocopying done for another research project. He continues to research Marion Land Company where his family first settled Northern Wimmera Area. John's grandfather was the first manager of the Marion Land Company and original shareholders were Martin Brennan, John Cromie, Peter Galbraith, Mary Hunter, Thomas Hutchings, James Hutchings,

Gordon Maconachie. John McAllister and Charles Proctor.

John played football for the Brim Football Club in the South Mallee league and for Warracknabeal Football Club in the Wimmera League. Another of his current missions is to collate the Southern Mallee League history. John is keen to hear from anyone who has knowledge of these histories. He continues to be concerned about the preservation of


## Kel - "I have written a book"


