Many of our other priorities were also acted upon and resolved.

We have invited VicRoads re the Drysdale Bypass and High Street upgrade, CoGG 30 Year Visioning group, CoGG re the Clifton Springs Foreshore and the Dell, Towards 1,000,000 Fishing Licenses, Cycling group, Potato Shed, Drysdale Clifton Springs Sports Precinct, Drysdale Landfill, Buses on the Bellarine, Port Phillip Ferries, Drysdale Town Centre, Structure Plan for Drysdale Clifton Springs and Drysdale Urban Design Framework, How can we work together as a combined Council Ward, Community Safety and Community Health especially aged care.

Once again it's a very full dance card – we are updating our Summit website to allow people to view information about the topic prior to the Summit.

If you have any other subjects / issues that should be on display to be discussed please let me know as soon as possible to ensure this can be included if possible. If you would like to help make this Summit a success we would love to have your help. 

DCSCA's big night out

DCSCA will hold its 2016 Annual General Meeting (AGM) on 19 October 2016 at 7pm, at SpringDale Neighbourhood Centre. The DCSCA Committee will tell DCSCA members about its work and invites their responses; and members will elect a new Committee to run the association for the next year. We also manage some socialising after the serious business.

In 2015-2016, DCSCA ran the local Clean Up Australia Day and - with Bellarine Catchment Network - an annual Environment Day for schools. We submitted our views to relevant authorities about many issues, eg. Drysdale town square, a proposed new bottle shop, an offshore sculpture gallery, the Environment Protection Agency's role, managing residential development and governing Geelong council. DCSCA sits on the Bellarine Community Safety Group and on the Drysdale Tip and Bellarine Rail Trail consultative groups.

Festival news

2017 will see DCSCA's eighth annual Festival of Glass in Drysdale, convened by Doug Carson; and Lyn Ingles's promotional graphics will start to appear soon. Diane Schofield's team have recruited twenty four businesses already for the 2017 Festival's Treasure Hunt; and Mercedes Drummond's team will bring Davide Penso from Murano in Italy, to the 2017 Festival. Murano's reputation for excellent glass art is centuries-old and Davide will hold a masterclass, demonstrations and classes. Meanwhile, the Festival's "Welcome to Drysdale" glass mural is due for installation in the town square.

We welcome everyone to the AGM, although only DCSCA members can vote on issues and elect the Committee. DCSCA members are welcome at any DCSCA activities, including meetings of the DCSCA committee, which meets on the first Tuesday of the month at SpringDale to discuss issues raised by local people.

Bellarine Support Group for Kinship Carers

How are little group has grown in the 12 months. Our members total over 15 kinship carers (and over 35 children) come from all over our region - from St. Leonards to East Geelong. Most of our members are grandparents caring full time for their grandchildren, but recently a few aunts and uncles joined our group. Not every kinship carers story is the same, we listen, we share our experiences and we offer any advice or assistance that we can.

The problems that face so many kinship carers, is they do not know where to go to get help. Getting assistance with such things as dealing with schools, Centrelink and how to deal with DHHS can be a major headache and nightmare for kinship carers.

Many kinship carers are aged over 60 years of age but take on the role of caring for their grandchildren when their grandchildren need them the most. Being a kinship carer is keeping families together.

Most of the carers in our group are Informal/ Non-Statutory carers which means that the authorities were not involved in removing the children from their parents.

Also, we have a few Formal/Statutory carers which means the children were removed by the authorities (and hence they receive payment) from their parents for their own protection, then placed in the care of their grandparents.

The Informal/Non-Statutory carers in our

group are all very proud people, and would not ask for help. But the financial burden placed on Informal carers should not be tolerated. Every kinship carer should receive financial assistance for raising the young Australians in their care.

If you are a kinship carer we would love you to join our group. We never judge we just listen. Our next meeting is on Monday 3rd October 10am - 1pm (we often go longer because we laugh so much). Hope see you on the 3rd October.



More than Bali, Batik and Bintang

I would love to share my enthusiasm for Indonesia with others in our wonderful community, and I hope you will check out the Expression of Interest page in the "Learn" part of our website, www.springdale.org.au. Indonesia has been part of my life for quite a long time.

My introduction to the country was in a Dutch restaurant in Little Malop Street, way back in the 1950s. I was about ten years old and their nasi goreng was the most delicious food I had ever tasted. Years later I decided to add nasi goreng to my basic sausage, egg and chips repertoire. I fried some rice, added some prawns and vegetables, and served it for dinner. My guests said it was like eating hot gravel. I realised then that (a) the rice should be cooked first and (b) that I had a lot to learn about Indonesian cuisine. I needed to visit Indonesia.

I bought a ticket and a guide book. The book told me about Bali, batik and Bintang beer and that is what I expected. I was so wrong.

Indonesia is much, much more than that. I kept going back for years and I loved it.

It inspired me to major in Indonesian at Deakin Uni and spend the second year of my course studying in Java. After I graduated I taught English in Indonesia for two years, spent another two years as a translator/ editor at Indonesia's State Islamic University, and then worked for an international energy company in Jakarta.

I would love to introduce others to Indonesia and Indonesian, ideally in the sort of stress free, laid back social environment that the SpringDale Community Centre offers. We could start to unpack what makes Indonesia tick by looking at its history, people and culture, or focus more on the elements of spoken Indonesian that would be useful in Bali and beyond. Or both. In the process we could share a few stories and have lots of laughs. And thanks to the new kitchen we might even cook some proper nasi goreng!

Coral Coast Rehabilitation



I am a Drysdale resident and one of the volunteers that make up Coral Coast Rehabilitation, a not-for-profit Australian based organisation, established to provide free rehabilitation to the people living on the Coral Coast of Fiji. This November both myself and fellow Drysdale resident Peter Terry - Physio (Drysdale Physiotherapy and Sports Injury Clinic) will be heading to Fiji with a team of Victorian volunteers for 2 weeks to deliver vital health care and supplies. The team is made up of Physios, Podiatrists, Occupational Therapists, a Doctor, Orthoptists and other health care workers who are committed to make a difference in the lives of people with minimal access to the services we take for granted.

This will be the third annual visit Coral Coast Rehabilitation (CCR) has made to Fiji's South Eastern villages providing vital health programs and equipment. In November we are planning to run free clinics as well as provide much needed equipment including reading glasses and wheelchairs. Last year over 1000 patients were seen in the two weeks at our clinics.

One of the organisation's major sponsors Virgin airlines are providing a 500kg allowance - this means we can take several wheelchairs that have been donated to provide to people who do not currently have access to one. Providing this type of equipment can mean a huge improvement in the lives of these people who simply spend their days house-bound, often lying on a mattress all day.

Diabetes is a big concern in this region. We are currently fundraising for 1000 blood sugar testing strips (\$40 for box of 100) and blood sugar monitors (\$50ea). This will ensure we

leave the local village nurses with a supply for 12 months till we return. Local companies may wish to help out towards one of these items which Peter and I will personally deliver and capture photos too. We are also looking for someone with a small truck/ute who could assist us in getting some wheelchairs from Drysdale to Tullamarine on Sunday 6 November.

Other items CCR are looking to take this year are: reading glasses, medical supplies, educational books and toys, pens, paper, stationary items, summer clothes in good condition (all sizes.) Collection can be arranged by either Peter or myself if any local residents are able to assist. 

In Season Now - Broad Beans

Some people have bad and sad memories of being forced to eat broad beans, either over cooked or very bland. The Europeans have a different take on them and according to tradition, Sicily once experienced a failure of all crops except for broad beans that kept everyone from starving. Broad beans subsequently became a popular tradition in many Italian communities and to this day people carry a broad bean for good luck believing they will never be without the essentials of life.

To celebrate spring some Italian families go on a picnic and traditionally eat young, fresh broad beans with fresh Pecorino or Parmesan cheese and local salami. In some Italian regions, a popular soup of broad beans is made with garlic, onions or leeks and beet leaves stir-fried, before being added to the soup, drizzled with olive oil and bits of bacon or prosciutto as an option.

Broad beans is also popular In Portugal and Spain and at Christmas a cake is baked with a dried broad bean inside. Whoever has the slice with it, is supposed to buy next year's cake.

A similar tradition exists in France, where a dried broad bean (these days a small trinket)

is placed in the galette des rows (The King's cake); the person who finds it in their slice is the king or queen of the meal, and is often expected to serve the other guests a drink.

Broad beans are very good for you! They provide lots of healthy nutrients and are a good food source of vitamin B1, iron, copper, phosphorus, potassium and magnesium!

Cook them together with peas and artichokes to have with fish or meat

Add with leek or onion, fennel and peas, blend to make a thick, hearty soup.

Enjoy them young and fresh in salads or as a dip with fresh young peas.

Broad Bean Dip

1 cup fresh broad beans (shelled)

1 cup cream cheese (at room temperature) or yoghurt, or cream fraiche

Juice of 1 small lemon

Dill or fennel fronds for the top

Boil broad beans for 2 minutes.

Serve with fresh vegetable sticks

Blend together with the cheese or yoghurt and lemon juice.

Decorate with the fronds of dill or fennel.

Safer Communities

BOAT THEFTS

Boat thefts have occurred on the Bellarine Peninsula in recent weeks. And recently a wake board boat was stolen from a Highton address and a small aluminium boat from Belmont. Both incidents occurred during daylight hours. Unfortunately, opportunists are out there willing to take what is not theirs.

Stealing a boat is much easier if a thief can hitch up to your boat and trailer and drive away. We urge boat owners to take extra precautions to reduce the risk of theft with these tips below:

- Store trailer and boat in a locked garage, secured boat storage facility or mini-storage unit.
- If the trailer is stored at home, put it in the back or side yard out of sight.
- Store it with the trailer tongue not easily accessible.
- · Consider removing one trailer wheel.
- Secure the trailer to an anchored object with a good quality chain and lock.
- Purchase a good quality trailer hitch lock and wheel clamp AND USE IT even if stored inside.

CONSIDER A GPS TRACKER FOR YOUR BOAT OR CAR

Fitting of GPS tracker to cars and boats could prove useful in the event of theft. GPS trackers are relatively easy to install and reasonably cheap. They are available from electronic stores such as Jaycar or online. The tracker needs to be reasonably near the surface of the vehicle to get a good signal and will only work where there is mobile coverage.





REPORT CRIME TO POLICE -NOT FACEBOOK



Water-Smart Gardening High pressure High pressure systems

We have holiday plans this summer, but we still want to have a productive garden. So what are our options?



Most irrigation systems are designed to work on a pressure of 15-30 psi (100-200 kPa). Mains pressure may be twice that, so an inline pressure reducer is needed to stop fittings and drippers from blowing out.

Sprinklers achieve good coverage but are wasteful. Also wet foliage is an invitation to mildew. Tall plants may block the spray, leading to uneven watering. All the same, sprinklers are a great solution in the right situation, and I'm thinking of installing a few around the chook pen to keep the girls safe in the hot weather while we're away.

Driplines are 5mm or 13mm tubes with drippers every 30 cm. They deliver a steady drip of water which soaks into the soil rather than evaporating like the mist from sprinklers. The drippers have a pressure regulator to ensure that each one emits the same amount of water along the whole length of the line. Drippers have limited coverage, which can make them tedious and expensive to install over a wide area. Plenty of organic material in the soil and mulch on top will help with their shortcomings.

Low and no-pressure systems

Our Landshare garden doesn't have electricity. Without a pump, drip and sprinkler irrigation won't work. (We'd need a tank stand 10 metres high to get enough pressure.) However, there are some options.

Wetpots (ollas) will work on any gravityfed system. The only requirement is for the water level in the tank to be higher than the wetpots. The tap at the tank is always open, so that the clay pots are always full of water. The water slowly seeps out of the unglazed clay pots into the surrounding soil. This system is expensive but very effective. I use mine mostly for tomatoes, which like consistent soil moisture.

Wicking beds and pots are a 'no-pressure' system in that they use capillary action to draw the water upwards from a reservoir below the growing medium. As long as I top up the reservoir periodically, the plant roots will receive consistent watering.

A deep peastraw mulch will keep crops like potatoes alive for weeks without watering, even in the hottest weather. A light shadecloth or **Vege-net** will take the sting out of the heat and act as a windbreak too, reducing water loss.
