Drysdale Bypass

The Drysdale Bypass is progressing and over the last 9 months much of the work has been able to be done with little impact to the flow of traffic but over the next few months traffic conditions will change a number of times. I encourage you to stay up to date with the works and please allow a little more time for your travel. Major Roads Projects Victoria Drysdale Bypass Project Team are committed to keeping you informed email contact@roadprojects.vic.gov.au or call 1800 105 105.

During October to December Portarlington Road between the Portarlington Road, Grubb Road, Jetty Road roundabout and Leura Park will be reduced to 3 lanes to enable the connection of Portarlington Road and Grubb Road into the Bypass to be built. During this time, the High Street traffic will be switched to the newly built lanes near Reserve Road to enable works to begin on the other side of High Street.

City of Greater Geelong is also going through a process to rename roads and infrastructure impacted by the Bypass. The City of Greater Geelong are in dialogue with people who live on these roads and streets but I believe a number of these decisions are of interest to our whole community. Submissions are being accepted by City of Greater Geelong until 7 October.

As the largest piece of infrastructure that has been built in our area for many years, this will bring a great deal of change. We must keep thinking and talking about how it will affect each of us and what we can plan to enable us to appreciate the opportunities that it will present.



News from Lisa Neville MP Member for Bellarine

Smoke Alarm Awareness Campaign

In mid-August, as Minister for Police and Emergency Services, I launched an important state wide advertising campaign promoting the installation of smoke alarms in all bedrooms. The launch featured people sleeping peacefully in bed while silent and deadly smoke fills the room.

Through the campaign Victorians are being urged to give themselves and their families the best chance of surviving a house fire by ensuring working smoke alarms are installed in all bedrooms.

The new safety warning from fire agencies recognises the potentially deadly consequence of silence as a fire spreads while people sleep. CFA data collected over the past 10 years shows that bedroom fires were the most likely to cause death or serious injury, with our sense of smell and ability to detect smoke reduced as we sleep.

It marks a significant change to previous guidance that smoke alarms were only

necessary outside bedrooms and in hallways.

For fires that resulted in a death or serious injury, 25 per cent started in sleeping areas (22 deaths and 117 serious injuries), followed by lounge rooms (20 per cent) and kitchens (16 per cent). So I urge readers to take heed of this campaign and have smoke alarms installed in all bedrooms.

Community Safety Grants Open

Applications for the State Government Community Safety Fund are now open.

Community groups and local councils are invited to apply for grants of up to \$25,000 to support local crime prevention initiatives.

As part of an expanded education and awareness focus this year, initiatives which support communities to better understand the justice system in Victoria are also eligible for funding.

Any groups considering applying for a grant are encouraged to contact the Department of Justice and Community Safety to discuss their ideas by emailing csfgrants@justice.vic.gov.au

Major Road Projects Victoria is aware that some members of the community have advocated for an access road from Portarlington Road to Jetty Road in Drysdale.

This proposal was thoroughly investigated. Engineers found the proposed access road would reduce travel times slightly, however this option was not pursued because it would reduce safety for cyclists and pedestrians.

The City of Greater Geelong is currently building Tivoli Drive, which will perform a similar function as the access road from Portarlington Road to Jetty Road.

The \$117 million Drysdale Bypass is due to be completed in mid-2020.

It's pleasing to see the weather is on the improve, since I last updated you on what's been keeping me busy at council.

Recently, Cr Stephanie Asher and I gave a briefing to the Bellarine Community Combined Associations in Drysdale, where among other things, members were keen to discuss rural and peri-urban issues.

As part of my role in the Rural and Peri-Urban Advisory Committee, I can assure all those interested that we have been working hard on the matters affecting our rural and peri-urban residents.

We've been looking at City-managed rural roads and vegetation and pest plants and animals, and are implementing some useful programs.

Some of these programs involve coordinated work on adjoining private land, to maximise effectiveness and success.

Members at the gathering told us they're also interested in the Bellarine trialling a fourth bin for paper and cardboard.

Given Victoria is in the grip of a recycling crisis, the City has been investigating recycling options for some time now.

At the moment, recyclables in the household yellow bin are unfortunately going to landfill.

While the City lobbies the state government for further action and continues looking at

all options, Bellarine locals are encouraged to bring their sorted paper and cardboard,

and aluminium and steel cans to the Drysdale Resource Recovery Centre for recycling.

Meanwhile as chair of the Arts, Culture and Heritage portfolio, I'm proud to say there's always something for everyone at the Potato Shed in Drysdale.

I've been to a number of enjoyable productions there recently, including Neil Diamond and Bobby Darin - Legends of Vegas, Paris Underground and Swansong.

Despite being happily married and not needing any advice in that department, I'm looking forward to seeing My Brilliant Divorce in October.

There's also a Johnny O'Keefe and Roy Orbison act, a Rumpelstiltskin performance and the Geelong Harmony Chorus coming up.

And while I'm at it, the Potato Shed and Portarlington Neighbourhood House are hosting the North Bellarine Film Festival 2019 from November 15-17.

A number of years ago I was lucky enough to have a guided tour of the Drysdale Landfill Supervisor, Ray Stratton. I can't remember why I was invited but I jumped at the opportunity. I came away believing that members of our community would love to visit the landfill and learn about the processes.

After almost 4 years of suggesting that we should run Tip Tourism Tours, thanks to City of Greater Geelong and especially Dave McNamara and Mark Davies we did. Almost 30 people came on our trips to the Tip over two days, during Adult Learners' Week, and they are still raving about how good it was.

We had people attend from all over the Bellarine and one from Geelong. I was lucky enough to go to 3 of the 4 sessions that were run and I loved talking to like-minded people about the recycling opportunities offered at Drysdale Landfill.

We saw the free recycling areas for paint, cardboard and paper, ewaste (small appliances with a power cord eg toasters or kettles, computers TVs etc), bigger white goods including fridges, scrap metal, hard plastic and now soft plastic. If you took all of this out of your bins each week, there might not be anything left to put out on the curb. We learnt that broken glass is one of the chief contaminators of the comingled yellow bin, thus causing the recycling to be placed in the landfill. We learned so much and many have committed to separating the recycling at home and making monthly trips to the landfill.

Because the feedback has been so positive I am sure we will continue to partner with City of Greater Geelong to bring these tourism opportunities to our community, hopefully a couple of times a year. I am looking forward to having a recycling quiz in each Messenger for the next few years to help us to learn how to recycle specific items.

At SpringDale we try to do our bit by collecting clothing and bedding for the Homeless in conjunction with Corio Norlane Lions Club, household batteries in conjunction with Rotary Club of Drysdale, food in conjunction with Drysdale Community Church, Plastic bottle tops in conjunction with Envision Hands and more.



LATHAM'S SNIPE



The Latham's Snipe is a bird that is hard to view as it is so shy and loves to hide amongst well vegetated, fresh water and marshy land. The birds do not like too deeper water consequently prefer to wade through shallows, in order that if frightened they can immediately hide amongst the rushes that line the waterways. The bird is well camouflaged so it takes a tried and true birder to notice where they live and to observe them. The reward is great when one is sighted.

These snipes are visitors to our land, flying from Japan each year to settle in our freshwater shallows arriving late September then making the long, journey home to Japan in April to nest and bring up their young. They are strong flyers that can be admired for their tenacity.

This photograph was taken at Lake Lorne. A most unusual shot as the bird is well in the open. It was trying to find a new home within the reed beds however had a hard hunt as many of the reed beds had their yearly trim by council workers.

The new ring road has had an influence on a small group of these birds as their holiday shelter was the marsh land beside Grub Road. Now the marsh land has been drained and their area is home to a large roundabout so the small group have had to move from this area and search for a new place to live. A few like this individual tried to make Lake Lorne their home but alas the reeds have been cleared and it was too exposed for them. They didn't stay long. VicRoads have listened to appeals and promise to re-establish wetlands with growth nearby the roundabout so hopefully the birds won't leave us for ever and I look forward to their return.

There is a small covey of Latham's Snipe who have also settled in Ocean Grove. It is a delight to see them feeding quietly amongst the reeds whilst pedestrians and riders cruise by unaware of these tourists.

Memories of Yesteryear by the Older Generation of the Bellarine

Maggie Selina Butcher (Nee) Whitcombe 1885 - 1914 The Butcher Family - Part 2

Eric Butcher - Born 1911 - Died TBA

Eric was not a regular visitor; however, I do remember him as a travelling salesman for tableware. Sometimes he would stay with us at Spray Farm when he was working in the area. I remember very clearly that he loved his food. Father inherited the old Ice-cream Churn from his mother. She used it in the produce shop in Drysdale to make and sell Cornish Ice-cream. She would buy ice from the Bay Steamers when they called into Portarlington or Clifton Springs. But when our mother, Laura would make us Ice-cream, there were no ice deliveries to our place. We had to wait for a hail storm. Alan and I would sometimes have to wait for months before we'd get some ice cream. I remember on this one occasion when there was a huge storm, Eric was staying with us. Alan and I rushed out and collected the hail in a bucket, we got pelted from all directions and became completely saturated. We came in like drowned monkeys and urged our mother to make us some Ice Cream Custard. She never let us down, she got to and made us a lovely big bowl of ice cream, we had a little that night and there was enough left for us all the next day. She stored it in the Coolgardie with

the ice around it to keep it cold. Eric had been out that night on a date with a young lady and he came home a little hungry, so raided the kitchen for something to eat. Unfortunately, he found the ice cream. When mother went to serve the ice cream the next day, it was all gone. Eric had eaten the lot! You can imagine how disappointed we were.

Victor and Eric were keen on football and boxing. Eric in particular. From what I heard he could not separate the two sports. After fights with umpires and others on and off the field, I believe he was eventually banned from the game even as a spectator. Eric spent little time at school, he was unable to read and write until of mature age. In spite of his handicap he was a born salesman, he was appointed sales manager for Thornycroft Trucks, in Melbourne during the Second World War. (Thornycroft was a UK based vehicle manufacturer which built coaches, buses and trucks from 1896 – 1977).

After the war he went on to be Sales Manager at Sunbeam Corp, until retirement.

The Foundation Stone is Laid

The inscription on the foundation stone reads:-

This stone was laid March 25th,1891.

By
His Excellency the Right Honourable
John Adrian Louis Hope, GCMG
Earl of Hopetoun
Governor and Commander-in-Chief
Of the
Colony of Victoria

The Opening

The opening took place on the 1st July 1891 and was performed by Major-General Tulloch.

The official party had arrived at Portarlington on board The Vulcan, the engineers steamer from Swan Island. The President and Councillors of the Bellarine Shire met the party at the jetty and arranged the transport to Drysdale. On arrival at Drysdale they found four hundred of the surrounding settlers assembled to witness the ceremony. Major General Tulloch thanked the Bellarine Shire for the handsome donation of the site of six acres and their interest in the project. After thanks to other personnel involved in the project he unveiled the stone bearing the following inscription.

United Services Home opened 1st July 1891 By Major- General A B Tulloch, CB Commanding Military Forces of Victoria He declared the home open and the veterans standing on the north veranda saluted as the gathering sang "God Save the Queen".

The eight old veterans in their uniforms, who were to live in the home, were in high spirits at the prospects of spending the remaining nights of their lives on spring mattresses and having wholesome meals in comfortable rooms.

Of the first inmates at the home, one was a royal navy man, five were soldiers and two were marines. Their names and regiments were:-

Jeremiah Brown (Regiment ??)

Luke Read (Royal Navy)

William Colthurst (101st Regiment)

John A Hicks (40th Regiment)

James Thompson (Royal Marines)

Andrew Desmond (18th Royal Irish)

Thomas Finnman (Royal Marines)

Hugh Patterson (12th Regiment)
